A MOTION authorizing the county executive to enter into agreements with King County small cities to exchange Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds and to facilitate transportation improvements in King County.

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) has approved the distribution of federal fiscal year (FFY) 1996 -1998 Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds to the jurisdictions in King County in the amount shown in the attached document, Figure 1, and

WHEREAS, King County initiated and facilitated an exchange of STP funds with King County small cities in 1992 within the guidelines established by the Federal Highway Administration, and

WHEREAS, the cities included in the 1992 exchange of funds were the cities of Algona, Beaux Arts, Bothell, Clyde Hill, Des Moines, Enumclaw, Hunts Point, Lake Forest Park, Medina, Milton, Newcastle, Normandy Park, Pacific, Yarrow Point, and

WHEREAS, the City of Issaquah has also indicated interest in exchanging funds, and

WHEREAS, the allocation results in a level of STP funding for some small agencies that is not adequate of fiscally feasible to support a federal-aid project within the procedural requirements set by the Federal Highway Administration, and

WHEREAS, some of the small agencies desire to exchange STP funds with King County in order to make transportation improvements in their jurisdictions that would not qualify as federal-aid highway projects, and

WHEREAS, the King County Roads Capital Improvement

Program could make use of additional federal STP funds; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

A. The county executive is hereby authorized to negotiate STP fund exchanges with interested King County small cities for the exchange of King County's road fund monies for the local agencies' small transportation improvement projects to promote transportation preservation improvements in King County.
