2 A MOTION authorizing the county executive
3 to enter into agreements with King County
4 small cities to exchange Surface
5 Transportation Program (STP) funds and to
6 facilitate transportation improvements in
7 King County.

9 WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) has
10 approved the distribution of federal fiscal year (FFY) 1996 -
11 1998 Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds to the
12 jurisdictions in King County in the amount shown in the
13 attached document, Figure 1, and

14 WHEREAS, King County initiated and facilitated an
15 exchange of STP funds with King County small cities in 1992
16 within the guidelines established by the Federal Highway
17 Administration, and

18 WHEREAS, the cities included in the 1992 exchange of
19 funds were the cities of Algona, Beaux Arts, Bothell, Clyde
20 Hill, Des Moines, Enumclaw, Hunts Point, Lake Forest Park,
21 Medina, Milton, Newcastle, Normandy Park, Pacific, Yarrow
22 Point, and

1 WHEREAS, the City of Issaquah has also indicated
2 interest in exchanging funds, and

3 WHEREAS, the allocation results in a level of STP
4 funding for some small agencies that is not adequate of
5 fiscally feasible to support a federal-aid project within the
6 procedural requirements set by the Federal Highway
7 Administration, and

8 WHEREAS, some of the small agencies desire to exchange
9 STP funds with King County in order to make transportation
10 improvements in their jurisdictions that would not qualify as
11 federal-aid highway projects, and

12 WHEREAS, the King County Roads Capital Improvement
13 Program could make use of additional federal STP funds; and

14 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King
15 County:

16 A. The county executive is hereby authorized to
17 negotiate STP fund exchanges with interested King County
18 small cities for the exchange of King County's road fund
19 monies for the local agencies' small transportation
20 improvement projects to promote transportation preservation
21 improvements in King County.
