MOTION NO. 10254

A MOTION requesting the Puget Sound Regional Council to include a truck priority corridor designation in the Metropolitan Transportation Plan.

WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) is the Metropolitan Planning Organization and Regional Transportation Planning Organization for King, Pierce, Snohomish and Kitsap Counties, and

WHEREAS, the PSRC is responsible for preparation of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) which meets the federal regional transportation planning requirements of the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA), and

WHEREAS, freight mobility is a component of the MTP, and WHEREAS, the PSRC is currently preparing refinements to the MTP for its 1998 update, and

WHEREAS, freight mobility improvements are vital to the economic growth of the Puget Sound Region, and

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WHEREAS, freight mobility must be addressed and planned as a combined system of ports, rail lines, highways, and supporting facilities, and

WHEREAS, designation of truck priority corridors can lead to innovative improvements to improve truck traffic conditions and travel time, including: truck signal priority, radius improvements, truck layover space, pavement strengthening, and other truck congestion relief projects, and

WHEREAS, designation of truck priority corridors and truck mobility criteria can improve the competitiveness of freight mobility improvements in funding processes, and

WHEREAS, the King County Comprehensive Plan includes freight facilities as part of the county transportation system;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Puget Sound Regional Council is hereby requested to consider the inclusion of a designated truck priority corridor or corridors as part of the freight mobility component of the 1998 refinements to the Metropolitan Transportation Plan. The PSRC should review and add emphasis to the criteria for the rating and eligibility of truck related improvements in its Transportation Improvement

program and grant scoring processes. Truck priority designations should be considered in capital programming decisions and should be used as a factor in establishing the importance of the project when prioritizing construction.
