MOTION NO. 10337

A MOTION relating to the council's continued review of the 1996-97 Charter Review Commission's recommendations and council introduced charter amendments

WHEREAS, Section 800 of the King County Charter requires that the charter be

reviewed at least once every ten years by an appointed advisory committee of knowledgeable citizens representing a diversity of the public that King County serves; and

WHEREAS, the 1996-97 Charter Review Commission was appointed by Executive Locke and confirmed by the metropolitan King County council to fulfill the requirement of Section 800 of the King County Charter; and

WHEREAS, the scope of the commission's mission as assigned by the executive was to review all existing provisions of the charter and develop recommendations for any technical amendments to improve the operation of county government; review all existing provisions of the charter and develop recommendations for any necessary structural changes to improve the organization of county government; and assess King County's role as a regional government and to recommend any necessary amendments to improve the county's ability to deliver regional services; and

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WHEREAS, the 1996-97 Charter Review Commission forwarded twelve recommendations to the metropolitan King County council for consideration including ten charter amendments and two ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the council considered the ten charter amendments at a series of Committee-of-the-Whole meetings from July 7, 1997 to September 15, 1997; and

WHEREAS, the council placed five of these charter amendments on the general election ballot for November, 1997; and

WHEREAS, the council considered two council-initiated charter amendments and placed one on the general election ballot for November, 1997; and

WHEREAS, the time available to consider the commission's recommendations was very limited; and

WHEREAS, the council chose to consider the two ordinances which were not charter amendments after the deadlines passed for placement of issues on the general election ballot for November, 1997; and

WHEREAS, the charter is the "constitutional" document for the county and charter amendments must be considered very carefully; and

WHEREAS, this is the first comprehensive charter review to occur after the King County/METRO merger; and

WHEREAS, certain proposed charter amendments would change sections of the charter which were the subject of inter-jurisdictional negotiations and may unintentionally affect the results of those negotiations; and

WHEREAS, certain proposed charter amendments raise legal issues requiring substantial legal analysis that could result in redrafting;

(1) The following process shall be used to consider the charter amendments and ordinances which were submitted by the 1996-97 Charter Review Commission or introduced by members but not acted upon by the Council in September, 1997:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- (a) The council will seek a thorough review of the commission's recommendations and council introduced charter amendments and will work to develop a consensus or a strong majority position which respectfully accepts, rejects, or modifies proposed ordinances;
- (b) Proposed Ordinances 97-134; 97-402, 97-403, 97-405, 97-406, 97-409, 97-411 and 97-412 shall remain in the Committee of the Whole;
- (c) The Committee-of-the-Whole shall begin its review of these ordinances in January, 1998, according to the following schedule:
- (1) Proposed Ordinances 97-405, 97-409, and 97-412 shall be considered beginning in January, 1998, and
- (2) Proposed Ordinances 97-134; 97-402, 97-403, 97-406, and 97-411 shall be considered beginning in April, 1998;
- (d) The Committee-of-the-Whole will complete its review of possible charter amendments in July, 1998, consistent with time frames for placing issues on the general election ballot in November, 1998.
- (2) The Council shall review the makeup and methods of appointment of future Charter Review Commissions with the goal of achieving equitable geographic balance in their structure.

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1	(3) Should the voters approve in November, 1997, the charter amendment to create an
2	independent Board of Ethics, the council shall begin review of an implementing ordinance
3	for the Board of Ethics beginning in January, 1998.
