A MOTION approving an optical scan vote tabulation system for King County.

WHEREAS, punch card systems have been used by King County to tabulate election votes since 1971, and

WHEREAS, considerable advancements in technology have been made since that time, and

WHEREAS, such advancements threaten to make punch card vote tabulation systems obsolete, and

WHEREAS, it is increasingly difficult to obtain punch cards for King County's current punch card system, and

WHEREAS, the division of records and elections has considered replacing the current punch card system with an optical scan vote tabulation system, and

WHEREAS, other jurisdictions across the nation have implemented similar optical scan systems, and

WHEREAS, the council included a proviso in a technical corrections ordinance to the 1996 adopted budget stipulating that the purchase of a new election system would require council approval via motion, and

WHEREAS, the council wants to ensure the implementation of an effective, reliable, user-friendly and, above all, safe and secure vote tabulation system;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The purchase of an optical scan vote tabulation system for implementation no earlier than 1998 is approved by the county council contingent upon the following:

A. The division of records and elections shall use the period before implementation of this new system to communicate with the public on its use and to gather public input on ways to ensure the safety, security, and effectiveness of the new voting process.

- B. By July 1, 1998, the division of records and elections shall, at minimum, develop and report the following to the county council:
- 1. procedures that ensure the safe and secure transportation of ballot materials to and from polling places;
- 2. procedures that ensure the safe and secure handling of ballot materials in individual polling places and that account for the general physical abilities of polling place staff and volunteers; and
- 3. materials that inform voters of the proper use of the optical scan ballots, including guidance on the types of vote marks that are readable by the system, the approximate fraction of the vote mark space that needs to be filled in to be read by the system, and the types of marking instruments that make marks that can be read by the system.
