A MOTION reaffirming King County's historical participation in the National Association of Counties and endorsing County involvement over the next four years.

WHEREAS, the National Association of Counties (NACo) was formed to stimulate the continuing improvement of county government, to serve as the national spokesperson for county government, to contribute to the knowledge and awareness of county government's heritage and its future, to serve as a liaison between the nation's counties and other levels of government and to achieve public understanding of the role of counties in the federal system, and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Counties is a highly respected national lobbying organization advocating on behalf of 1,700 counties and the only national organization representing the interests of county governments before Congress and the White House, and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Counties through its ad-hoc and steering committees applies the resources of its members toward major issues facing King County, the State of Washington and our nation such as electric utility deregulation, transportation, telecommunications, health care, community and economic development, employment,

agricultural and rural affairs, arts and cultural resources, environmental and land use policies, human services, education, criminal justice, public safety, public lands, labor and employee benefits and taxation and finance, and

WHEREAS, in the last several years, the National Association of Counties has been the moving force behind the passage of several pieces of major federal legislation such as unfunded mandates, welfare reform and the reauthorization of the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act, and

WHEREAS, King County has been an active participant in the National Association of Counties for thirty-four years, and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Counties provides King County elected officials and staff with opportunities to research, explore and discuss county related issues with our county colleagues from around the United States, and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Counties offers training, legislative updates and exposure to top elected and cabinet level officials through its legislative and annual conferences, and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Counties has thirty affiliated professional organizations and caucuses, such as the National Association of Elected County Executives and the National Association of County Engineers, which provide county elected officials and professional staff with the opportunity to meet with colleagues from around the nation, and

WHEREAS, the King County executive is an elected county official who provides
King County with a valuable and additional voice through the National Association of
Counties' Elected County Executives Association, and

WHEREAS, King County supports the continued unification of the National Association of Counties with its affiliated associations in order to provide a strong singular voice on county issues, and

WHEREAS, in July of 1997, Councilmember Jane Hague was unanimously elected by the representatives of the 1,700 member counties to serve as Second Vice President of the National Association of Counties, one of five members of the executive board and the only member representing the western United States, and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Jane Hague is in line to serve a one-year term as the President of the National Association of Counties beginning in July 2000;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. King County reaffirms its historical participation in the National Association of Counties and endorses King County's continued active involvement.
- B. King County endorses Councilmember Jane Hague's participation in the National Association of Counties and believes her representation of the county on the National Association of Counties Executive Board will benefit King County by raising its national profile and highlighting the achievements King County has made in many areas over the last several years.
