PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS

Catholic Community Services Transitional and Family Support Project

Program Description

Primarily, this project will target both medium and minimum security women (presentenced and sentenced) housed at the Regional Justice Center - Detention Facility located in Kent, who will upon release return to South King County Communities. More specifically, an emphasis will be placed on women who will likely be impacted by the WorkFirst Program. The goal of the WorkFirst Program is to get families off welfare and into the workforce. Before many of these women can begin any form of job search activities they will need assistance in stabilizing their environment. Basic needs such as shelter, clothing, food, and transportation will be the initial concerns of many of these women once released. Catholic Community Services will provide transitional assistance that will aid in that stabilization.

Emphasis will be placed on life skills, to include decision-making and stress management skills to develop strategies that will impact the revolving door syndrome. Many will need both emergency and long term housing support, alcohol/substance abuse treatment, parenting, daycare, and referrals to agencies that offer basic education classes and/or job training. The intent is to enhance the opportunities for successful transition from custody to community.

Scope Of Services

Determine and develop with the inmate an Individualized Transition Plan (ITP).

Conduct weekly workshops that address topics specific to appropriate decision-making strategies that will enhance successful community re-entry, basic survival/life skills, parenting, and budget management.

Provide appropriate support services (financial aid) as resources allow, for housing, food, utilities, alcohol/substance abuse treatment, etc.

Make available appropriate community resource information and/or linkages that will assist with successful community re-entry.

Upon release, former inmates may continue to seek assistance from the agency.

Special Conditions

Agency staff who will access the jail on a regular basis must successfully complete the Department's security background investigation process which includes completion of questionnaire, references, police checks, and fingerprinting if applicable.

Agency staff assigned to this project will be required to attend a minimum seven (7) hour training session facilitated by DAD staff.

The Agency will be required to submit monthly performance reports to DAD.
