WHEREAS, the King County arts commission is authorized by Ordinance 11242 to administer projects in the special projects program, and

WHEREAS, the King County arts commission, in an effort to provide increased community-based arts and cultural performance events for the residents of suburban and unincorporated King County, has recommended \$30,000 of the fund for the Community Arts Initiative to serve this purpose, and

WHEREAS, the King County arts commission received eleven applications for funding from King County libraries, parks and community sponsors, and

WHEREAS, the recommendation for arts projects adhere to the guidelines approved by the King County council in Motion 8797;

1998 COMMUNITY ARTS INITIATIVE - SUMMARY RECOMMENDATIONS SPECIAL PROJECTS PROGRAM

The Community Arts Initiative was created to provide an opportunity for underserved communities in King County to present quality arts programming for the benefit of residents. All of the programs provide free access to the arts, and in some instances, are the only cultural programs available.

1. Presenter: City of Des Moines Parks & Recreation Dept. Allocation: \$1,000

Project: "Family Fun in the Park Concert" Wednesday, July 22, 1998, Des Moines beach Park. 5:00 – 8:00 PM. Attendance 500.

"Teen Fest," (Des Moines, Kent, SeaTac, Tukwila) Saturday, August 15, 1998, 1:00 – 8:00 PM. Attendance 400.

2. Presenter: Friends of the Maple Valley Library Allocation: \$1,000

Project: "Summer Reading Spectacular," Virginia Moore uses harpsichord and masks to lead children through "Peter and the Wolf," Tuesday, June 30, Lake Wilderness Center. Attendance 300.

Simmone LaDrumma brings her collection of world drums to share culture and rhythms, Tuesday, July 21, with day camp, at Lake Wilderness Center. Attendance 300. Thistle Theatre presents their production of "Winnie the Pooh," Tuesday, July 7 at the Maple Valley Community Center. Attendance 350.

3. Presenter: Cascade Symphony Orchestra Allocation: \$1,000

Project: "Children's Concert," to be presented at the Shorecrest Performing Arts Center, Shoreline, in February, 1999. Performance of works by Beethoven (program TBA). Funds will be used to subsidize free admission for students K-12. Attendance: 350

4. Presenter: Kiwanis of Meridian, Kent Allocation: \$2,500

Project; "Washington Games for Physically Disabled Youth," hosts about 125 athletes and their families and friends in a day-long program in May (TBA). Funds in the amount of \$1,000 will be used to support clowns, jugglers and musicians throughout the free events. "Senior Picnic" funds \$1,500 artist fees for musical entertainment for the 22nd annual free event that attracts 800 seniors from all over South King County. Artists TBA.

5. Presenter: King County Library, Bothell Allocation: \$650

Project: "Family Night Summer Series," funds will be used to support artist fees for Adefua African Music and Dance, to be presented outdoors, free to the public. The events usually attract 100 people.

6. Presenter: King County Library, Carnation Allocation: \$750

Project: "Carnation 4th of July Festival," a free community event, featuring cowboy poet and musician John "Jay" Kulm. Funds will be used to support artist fees. Attendance is expected to be 400 people.

7. Presenter: Duvall Arts Commission Allocation: \$3,500

Project: "Sandblast '98 Arts Festival," to be held on July 24, 25 and 26 on the banks of the Snoqualmie River in Duvall's McCormick Park. Activities include professional sand-carving and pubic participation, three day ethnic dance festival with workshops and performance, an art walk, and "Music in the Park" during the festivities. Estimated attendance 800 each day. Free and open to all. KCAC funds support artist fees.

8. Presenter: Friends of the Fall City Library Allocation: \$1,000

Project: "Reggie Garrett and the Snakeoil Peddlers," a musical concert to be presented June 20, 1998, as part of the popular "Fall City Days" celebration. The events are held in the park across from the library and are free of charge. Attendance is expected at around 400 people for this event.

9. Presenter: City of Burien Parks and Recreation Department Allocation: \$1,000

Project: "Summer '98 / Winter '99 Concerts in the Park Program," provide family concerts, one in summer at Lake Burien School Memorial Park, and a children's concert at Highline Community Center in February. KCAC funds will be used to compensate culturally diverse artists to help broaden the cultural horizons of the community. Attendance is estimated at 350 per event.

10. Presenter: Inglewood High School Allocation: \$1,150

Project: "Bringing Professional Performing Arts into the School Community," a combination of workshops and residencies working with as many as 500 students, and a performance at Eastlake High School Performance Center. KCAC support continues several years of cooperative production with King County Parks and KCAC.

11. Presented at eight King County Parks in suburban and unicorporated communitites Total Allocation: \$15,450

Project: "Arts in the Parks," a series of programs:

Summer Spectacular Series, at Petrovitsky Park (Fairwood), Lake Wilderness Park (Maple Valley), Si View Park (North Bend), Tolt McDonald Park (Carnation), Marymoor Park (Redmond), Beaver Lake Park (Sammamish Plateau). Wednesdays, July 15-August 19, 11:00 am. Free. Attendance: 250/each.

Fall Series: People and Places Lake Wilderness Park (Maple Valley), Si View Park (North Bend), Tolt McDonald Park (Carnation), Marymoor Park (Redmond), Beaver Lake Park (Sammamish Plateau), Preston Community Center (Preston). Saturdays and Sundays, September – November, 2:00 PM. Free. Attendance: 125/each.

Return to Newcastle at Cougar Mountain, annual festival with 3,000 – 5,000 people. KCAC funds will be used to help support artist fees for all of the projects listed above.
