A MOTION commending the Bellevue Art Museum and expressing the Council's support for BAM 2000.

WHEREAS, the Bellevue Art Museum was founded in 1975 "to promote the art and artists of the region, to build the Eastside's strength as a cultural and arts educational center, and to involve the community in lively and engaging ways", and

WHEREAS, the Bellevue Art Museum's roots go back fifty-one years to the beginning of the Pacific Northwest Arts and Crafts Association annual summer arts festival in Bellevue, and

WHEREAS, over 55,000 people, including 10,000 children, visited the Bellevue Art Museum in 1997, and

WHEREAS, the Bellevue Art Museum has developed a nationally recognized focus on children and teaching children about the world of art, and

WHEREAS, the Bellevue Art Museum's children's programs will reach over 30,000 students in 1998 through programs at both the museum and in school classrooms around King County, and

WHEREAS, the Bellevue Art Museum has for the last several years operated a teen docent program which recruits teenagers from Bellevue's Youth Link to serve as museum docents leading tours for adults and children of the museum's exhibitions, and

WHEREAS, the Bellevue Art Museum has undertaken a campaign called BAM 2000 to construct a new, larger facility of regional importance in the heart of downtown Bellevue, and

WHEREAS, the Bellevue Art Museum's new 40,000 square foot facility, scheduled to open in 2000, will have four galleries and will increase its ability to display a wide variety of visiting and permanent collections, and

WHEREAS, BAM 2000 is working to raise over \$20 million for the new museum, and has already raised over \$11 million, including a \$3 million contribution from the City of Bellevue, a \$1 million contribution from the Kreielsheimer Foundation and other major contributions from the Boeing Company and members of the museum's board of trustees;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The county recognizes that the Bellevue Art Museum is a major arts and cultural resource for all of the adults and children of King County. The council commends the Bellevue Art Museum for 23 years of outstanding work to make art more accessible and available to the children and adults of the Eastside and King County. The council further expresses its support for the Bellevue Art Museum and its work to fulfill its dream for a new facility which will truly assist the people of King County in seeing, exploring and making art.
