**Emergency/Unforeseen Opportunities: Facilities Request** 

SEED/SouthEast Effective Development. SEED is requesting \$23,631 in emergency/unforeseen opportunity funding to replace broken sewer lines at the Rainier Valley Cultural Center in Columbia City. SEED is a non-profit community development agency with a 24 year history of cultural and economic service to the residents of this diverse South Seattle community. SEED owns and operates the Rainier Valley Cultural Center, a former Christian Science church which now houses a performance center, museum, and several community offices.

The application fits the definition of emergency, as detailed in the guidelines. During a June jazz concert, with a house full of 250 people, the sewer lines backed up, causing every toilet and drain in the facility to overflow. A major break in the line was discovered, and the facility was forced to shut down because of health hazards.

SEED is requesting \$23,631 from King County, out of a total \$46,383 project to replace these broken lines. The other half of the funding is coming from the Seattle Foundation (\$5,000 confirmed), the Nesholm Family Foundation (\$10,000 confirmed) and Glaser Foundation (\$5,000 pending) as well as from other sources pending.

SEED is capable of providing bridge financing, as the lines must be replaced immediately in order for the facility to re-open to classes and cultural programs.

The Arts Commission finds that this proposal truly meets the description of "emergency," due to the threat to public health and safety, and the timing of the sewer-line break outside of normal application timelines, and because the situation requires immediate attention. The Commission also appreciates SEED's efforts to secure other funding (50%) and bridge financing.

#### Emergency/Unforeseen Opportunities: Facilities Request

Empty Space Theatre: The Empty Space Theatre submitted an "emergency/unforeseen opportunity" request for \$28,700 to help cover renovation costs to convert warehouse space at 916 Maynard, in Seattle, into a central scene shop, costume and storage space. The "emergency" is that they lost their lease on one of their shops earlier in the year and have until September to move. The "unforeseen opportunity" component was the location of warehouse space owned by the Frye Art Museum, which is granting a 5-year lease with a 5-year option; clearly meeting the 10-year threshold in the guidelines. In addition, the relationship with the non-profit Frye locks the Space into generous terms, and consolidates what had been three separate facilities.

The committee sees this as an opportunity to further stabilize the Space, which is highly regarded for its' artistic innovation, programming balance, and tenacity. This move will protect the Space from a series of costly moves throughout the next decade (at least) and provide OSHA approved working conditions for the scenic and costume shops. Centralizing these activities from three spaces to one -- and under very favorable terms with the Frye -- seems to present an "unforeseen opportunity" as described in the guidelines.

The total project cost is \$143,610. The Seattle Foundation has confirmed \$10,000, and architectural design services are being contributes, as well as some construction materials. More than \$92,000 of the project is construction related. The KCAC request is just under 20% of the entire budget.
