1	A MOTION asking Congress to work with counties and
2	cities in their review and reauthorization of the federal
3	Pipeline Safety Program.
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6	WHEREAS, concern about pipeline safety has been expressed by municipalities
7	within King County, and
8	WHEREAS, the 106th Congress is in the process of review and reauthorization of
9	the federal Pipeline Safety Program, and
10	WHEREAS, the current federal program and the congressional reauthorization
11 ·	process provides for a role for state and local governments to participate in establishing
12	pipeline safety activities and standards;
13	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
14	The council finds that the safety of petroleum and natural gas pipelines is of
15	immense importance to the welfare of cities and their residents and, therefore, Congress
16	is requested to:
17	A. Evaluate amending the Pipeline Safety Act to allow states flexibility to impose

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18		safety requirements beyond the federal requirements;
19		B. Hold oversight hearings concerning the Office of Pipeline Safety's evaluation
20		of the National Transportation Safety Board's recommendations to develop rules for
21		periodic testing and OPS compliance with Congressional directives to define
22		"environmentally sensitive areas" and "high density population areas," and
23		C. Review rules regarding pipeline operation, maintenance, and public reporting
24		and consider strengthening those rules by including:
25		1. Requirements for federal certification of operator training and qualifications;
26		2. Increased inspection requirements for pipeline corrosion;
27		3. Requirements for study and implementation of state-of-the-art leak detection
28	·	systems;
29		4. Requirements for installation of effective fail safe mechanisms;
30		5. Safety standards for liquid fuel pipelines that are at least as stringent as those
31		for natural gas pipelines;
32		6. Requirements for pipeline operators to report to the Office of Pipeline Safety
33		and affected jurisdictions all spills except those spills truly de minimis in nature;
34		7. Requirements for pipeline operators to disclose to local and state authorities
35	•	the results of all pipeline inspections;
36		8. A requirement for the Office of Pipeline Safety to work with local emergency
37		response providers to develop preparedness and response plans, and provide appropriate
38		funding support to local jurisdictions to implement such plans;
39		9. Periodic management audits of pipeline companies to assure compliance with
40		the foregoing; and

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10. Enhanced funding to federal agencies charged with the oversight of pipeline

safety laws and regulations.
