			problems we seek to address, through which

			with the discussion of what governance structure
			would be appropriate for such an undertaking.
	COUNCIL	Governance	We do not foresee circumstances under which cities
			would no longer be responsible for maintaining
			their roads, or counties would similarly not be
			responsible for maintaining the roads in
			unincorporated communities.
	COUNCIL	Transportation –	We recognize that King County is one of the
		Revenue Allocation	wealthiest counties in the state, and has an
			obligation to subsidize the needs of poorer
			counties. However it is this very wealth which has
			created our extreme transportation congestion,
			congestion which threatens the economy of not
]			only King County but of the entire state. Solutions
			to gridlock in a dense, built-out community with
			very expensive real estate like ours are
			correspondingly much more expensive than in rural
·			or even largely suburban counties across the state.
	COUNCIL	Revenue Allocation	King County must retain (100%) of any locally
· ·			approved new monies raised from local sources for
			transportation projects; AND the State shall pay for
			100% of the maintenance of any state roads in King
			County.
