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8	WHEREAS, in accordance with RCW 39.04.280 and K.C.C. 4.16.050, the	
9	executive has determined an emergency exists at the Youth Facility Center, and attached	d
10	hereto and by this reference such determination is made a part thereof, and the council	
11	acknowledges receipt thereof, and	
12	WHEREAS, the department of adult and juvenile detention has reported to the	
13	King County executive, that on May 6, 2001, at approximately 8:00 p.m., a fire broke or	ut
14	at the youth services center at 1211 East Alder Street in an office on the third floor, and	
15	WHEREAS, fire investigators concluded that the fire was most likely started by	a
16	coffee pot and the court clerk's office located on the third floor near the fire, sustained	
17	heavy smoke damage, and	

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18	WHEREAS, the building ventilation system is now coated with soot and smells of
19	smoke, and twenty staff were displaced by the fire causing disruption to employees and
20	citizens who use the services, and
21	WHEREAS, persons and property are and will be threatened and damaged unless
22	further efforts are taken to reduce the threat of life and property, and
23	WHEREAS, on May 7 and 8, county risk management personnel met with the
24	county's insurance carrier to discuss the loss and inspect the damage, and
25	WHEREAS, a proposal for cleanup has been obtained from Restorx, a company
26	familiar and acceptable to the county's insurance carrier, and
27	WHEREAS, the ordinary requirements for formal competitive bidding of the
28	construction contracts under chapter 36.32 RCW and formal solicitation requirements for
29	professional/technical service contracts and the purchase of tangible personal property
30	under K.C.C. chapter 4.16 and compliance with minority and women's business
31	enterprises requirements under K.C.C. chapter 4.18 for such repairs must be waived in
32	order to prevent delay in beginning the repair work;
33	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

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The above waiver expires one hundred twenty days after the county has entered

35 into a contract, unless extended by motion of the county council.
