2002 Work Program

2002 Goals

- **Juvenile Justice:** To promote continued reductions in youth crime, youth involvement and racial disproportionality in the juvenile justice system and the cost of adjudication and incarceration, in accord with the adopted Juvenile Justice Operational Master Plan (JJOMP).
- Adult Justice: To adopt policies and plans for the adult justice system that significantly increase efficiency and effectiveness, reduce racial disproportionality and produce cost savings in a manner similar to improvements brought to the juvenile system by the JJOMP.
- Treatment Options: To assure that cost/effective treatment options are included in the adult justice system and that these options are to the maximum extent possible integrated with the on-going chemical dependency and mental health treatment systems.
- **Human Services:** To increase emphasis on human services that are proving successful in reducing involvement in the criminal justice system.
- Public Health: To provide direction, if necessary, regarding reduction in Public Health services due to potential loss of state funding for core services.
