16	recommendations relating to information technology, cable communication and
17	telecommunications, and

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18	WHEREAS, King County is experiencing unprecedented, continuing shortfalls in
19	the current expense fund, and
20	WHEREAS, the committee has, therefore, developed a work plan for 2002 to
21	facilitate its review of policy options and development of policy recommendations to
22	assist in cost effective solutions to these on-going financial problems, and
23	WHEREAS, the committee is seeking full council involvement in and support for
24	its work program;

Labor Policy Implementation

Goal: To review all labor agreements to ensure compliance with policies established by the labor policy committee.

Key Work Program Items:

- Review and act on approximately 20 proposed labor agreements in 2002;
- Help shape the Labor Summit agenda;
- Identify labor policies that could be adopted or changed to be consistent with council goals and priorities by June 2002.

Government Operations

Goal: Improve customer service and performance of county departments in a cost effective manner.

Key Work Program Items:

- Review King County Civic Television legislation, efficiency and productivity of operations and programming options.
- Recommend improved customer service policies and establish performance measurements for two or more County departments;
- Identify cost efficiency measures;
- Review and approve noise reduction actions for King County International Airport per the FAA Part 150 Study;
- Review and approve a new master plan for the King County International Airport;
- Explore opportunities to reduce energy use and costs;
- Solicit cost saving opportunities from all County employees and the public.

Technology

Goal: Make policy recommendations to improve county-wide technology planning that improves operational productivity and minimizes costs or produces savings.

Key Work Program Items:

- Help develop and act on the annual **information technology strategic plan** that will provide a county wide vision and coordination of technology management and investment across the county;
- Help develop and act on the annual **technology business plan** that will align multiple individual agency technology budgets with county-wide standards and policies;

- Review and act on the annual **technology report** that will provide a status of all technology projects; and
- Review and act on the renewal of the Millennium cable franchise and transfer of control of the AT&T Comcast cable franchise.
