Hague 1 A MOTION to adopt the King County International Airport 2 Master Plan and to approve and allocate federal 3 government grants for implementing the recommended 4 programs and projects. 5 6 7 WHEREAS, in 1995, the King County International Airport (KCIA) initiated 8 development of a master plan for the airport with the goal of providing flexible planning 9 guidelines, consistent with Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) guidance, for future 10 airport development which will satisfy aviation safety and demand in a financially 11 feasible manner, while at the same time addressing related aviation and environmental 12 issues, and 13 WHEREAS, in October 1998, the county council adopted Motion 98-260 adding 14 the environmental assessment/environmental impact statement ("EA/EIS") to the master

plan scope of work and requesting a delay in the process until substantial completion of a

Part 150 Noise and land use compatibility study, and

17	WHEREAS, during 2000 and 2001, the FAA further delayed the master plan
18	development to evaluate conditions associated with the runway safety area, including
19	compliance alternatives, and
20	WHEREAS, on July 25, 2001, the FAA accepted the draft master plan and the
21	runway safety area solution, the airport initiated the EA/EIS process, and
22	WHEREAS, on October 15, 2002, the county council adopted the Part 150 Noise
23	Study recommendations with a proviso for further study of several concerns. During
24	February 2003, the county council reviewed the issues that had been the subject of further
25	study and determined that no further action was necessary, and
26	WHEREAS, on December 12, 2003, the FAA accepted the new terminal area
27	forecast and the airport prepared a comprehensive update of the EA/EIS based on the new
28	long range aviation activity forecast, and
29	WHEREAS, the draft airport master plan proposes to continue to support a large
30	variety of aircraft and diverse tenant base, including the Boeing Company, as well as
31	bring the runway safety area into compliance with safety regulations, and
32	WHEREAS, the EA/EIS found no adverse environmental impacts and the United
33	States Fish and Wildlife Service concurred with the determinations, the airport published
34	the draft master plan and EA/EIS for a forty-five-day public review period in accordance
35	with the state Environmental Policy Act (WAC 197-11-455) and a public hearing was
36	held on April 5, 2004, and
37	WHEREAS, on June 14, 2004, the FAA published the finding of no significant
38	impact/record of decision, finding that the proposed federal action is consistent with
39	existing national environmental policies and objectives, as set forth in section 101(a) of

40	the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 ("NEPA"), and that such development
41	will not significantly affect the quality of the human environment, and
42	WHEREAS, the KCIA acting in its capacity as the state Environmental Policy
43	Act ("SEPA") lead agency issued the final NEPA Environmental Assessment/SEPA
14	Environmental Impact Statement for proposed master plan improvements on June 14,
45	2004, upon determining that the environmental document reasonably evaluates associated
46	impacts, mitigation measures and alternatives, and
<b>4</b> 7	WHEREAS, the county executive's recommendations are in compliance with
48	county council direction to develop an updated master plan and NEPA Environmental
<b>4</b> 9	Assessment/SEPA Environmental Impact Statement;
50	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED, by the Council of King County,
51	1. The King County International Airport Master Plan is hereby adopted. The
52	airport may develop, accept and allocate federal grants for program and project
53	implementation consistent with the master plan.
54	2. This King County International Airport Master Plan is dedicated to the
55	generous service and memory of Mr. Daniel B. Hartley, a flight test engineer who
56	worked for The Boeing Company and served as an original member of the Airport
57	Roundtable. Mr. Hartley served on the Roundtable for seven years until his passing on
58	March 17, 2004. Mr. Hartley's life was dedicated to the service of his country, his

59 community, his fellow employees and his employer. He gave freely of his time and 60 considerable intellect with integrity in the service of aviation and his faith.
