6	WHEREAS, the charter provides that the council shall elect one of its members as
7	chair, and Motion 10651, Section II, as amended, and OR 1-010 provides that the council
8	shall elect a chair who shall serve at the pleasure of the council for a term of one year,
9	unless otherwise ordered by the council, and
10	WHEREAS, the council has specified by motion the chairs, vice-chairs and
11	members of council committees and provided for any changes to these positions to be
12	made by adoption of a formal legislative motion, and
13	WHEREAS, the council desires to specify committee names and functions, and
14	WHEREAS, the council has specified by motion policies for members and staff;
15	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
16	I. Motion 11122, Section B, as amended, and OR 2-010 are each hereby amended
17	to read as follows:
18	OR 2-010. Committee of the whole - functions. The council may go into
19	committee of the whole at any time. The committee of the whole shall consider: issues

20	of interest to the entire council, including the annual work program and appointments to	
21	the state legislature and to the executive branch; the annual legislative program;	
22	legislation before the federal, state and local governments that affect King County;	
23	agendas for council meetings; the King County Strategic Plan; and other program and	
24	policy matters. The committee of the whole shall be responsible for conducting regular	
25	town hall meetings on issues of significance.	
26	The committee of the whole may hold briefings on the status of the mental illness	
27	and drug dependency fund services and programs.	
28	((For the purposes of K.C.C. chapter 3.16, the committee of the whole is	
29	designated as the committee responsible for establishing labor policy and the committee	
30	responsible for labor implementation, including labor agreements and labor-related issues	
31	such as employee benefits and implementation of the furlough. The committee of the	
32	whole shall-consider labor policy issues at least annually.))	
33	II. Motion 11122, Section D, as amended, and OR 2-020 are each hereby	
34	amended to read as follows:	
35	OR 2-020. Standing committees - functions. In addition to any committee	
36	otherwise established by law, the committees of the metropolitan King County council	
37	and their respective functions are established as follows:	
38	A. Budget and fiscal management committee shall consider and make	
39	recommendations on: the county revenue and expenditure fiscal structural gap; capital	
40	and operating budget appropriations; the sale and lease of real property to or by the	
41	county; debt and investment proposals; bond issues; the office of economic and financial	

42	analysis; and financial policies. The committee shall also consider the implementation of
43	appropriate labor agreements.
44	1. The committee shall develop recommendations on policy direction for the
45	((2011)) 2012 annual budget, based on the recommendations of other council committees
46	and taking into account the estimated fiscal impacts of state and federal legislation.
47	2. In respect to consideration of the county's proposed annual budget, all
48	members of the council not assigned to the budget and fiscal management committee
49	shall be considered ex officio voting members of the committee.
