14	WHER	EAS, King County's Growth M	Management Comprehensive Plan policies
15	E-208, F-316 a	nd F-317 specifically encourag	ge the use of solar energy both at King
16	County facilitie	es and in the community, and	
17	WHER	EAS, producing renewable end	ergy can also reduce greenhouse gas
18	emissions, and		

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19	WHEREAS, despite a rainy climate, solar energy in the Northwest has proven to		
20	be a viable energy option, and		
21	WHEREAS, promoting solar energy can encourage new energy technologies and		
22	green jobs that support a sustainable economy and energy independence, and		
23	WHEREAS, solar access is the availability or access to unobstructed, direct		
24	sunlight, and		
25	WHEREAS, one of the barriers to solar installation is a lack of solar access		
26	protection from development on neighboring properties, and		
27	WHEREAS, at the local level, communities use many different mechanisms to		
28	protect solar access, including solar access ordinances, development guidelines requiring		
29	proper street orientation, zoning ordinances that contain building height restrictions and		
30	solar permits, and		
31	WHEREAS the 2008 Growth Management Comprehensive Plan Policy F-316		
32	establishes that King County should study measures to protect solar access and		
33	implement best practices in this area, and		
34	WHEREAS, Washington state established the renewable energy system cost		
35	recovery program in RCW 82.16.110, 82.16.120, 82.16.130 and 82.16.140 that		
36	authorizes an incentive payment to help offset the costs associated with the purchase and		
37	use of renewable energy systems located in Washington state that produce electricity, and		
38	WHEREAS, the concept of a community solar project was added to the state's		
39	renewable energy system cost recovery program in 2009 in order to expand local solar		
40	energy projects and encourage a broader participation in the development of solar energy,		
41	and		

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42	WHEREAS, the expansion of the energy system cost recovery program allowed		
43	for the formation of community solar project ventures so individuals could pool resources		
44	and install solar panels on local public facilities that might have better access to full		
45	sunlight, and		
46	WHEREAS, community solar projects allow individuals, regardless of whether		
47	they own property, to own all or part of a solar energy system that generates up to		
48	seventy-five kilowatts of electricity and receive incentive payments, and		
49	WHEREAS, solar systems manufactured in Washington state receive a higher		
50	incentive payment, and		
51	WHEREAS, the incentive payments offered for the energy generated by		
52	community solar projects are some of highest in the world and can thus benefit citizen		
53	investors and participating local governments, and		
54	WHEREAS, the incentive payments authorized under RCW 82.16.110,		
55	82.16.120, 82.16.130 and 82.16.140 expire June 30, 2020, and		
56	WHEREAS, community solar projects are an exciting opportunity for local		
57	governments to participate in the expansion of solar energy because the program calls for		
58	the placement of the solar energy system on the property owned by a cooperating local		
59	government and also allows for the cooperating local government entity that owns the		
60	property on which the solar energy system is located to also be a member of the company		
61	that owns the solar system, and		
62	WHEREAS, Seattle City Light has launched the first community solar installation		
63	in King County, to be installed in Jefferson park in Seattle, and		

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64	WHEREAS, King County owns land and buildings throughout the county which		
65	may be good candidates for community solar projects, and		
66	WHEREAS, community solar projects offer many opportunities; further analysis		
67	is needed to determine the most effective way for King County to participate in the		
68	community solar projects envisioned in RCW 82.16.110, 82.16.120, 82.16.130 and		
69	82.16.140;		
70	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:		
71	A. The executive is requested to review the renewable energy system cost		
72	recovery program established under RCW 82.16.110, 82.16.120, 82.16.130 and		
73	82.16.140 and provide a report to the council by January 15, 2012, on options for King		
74	County to participate in community solar projects as authorized under RCW 82.16.110,		
75	82.16.120, 82.16.130 and 82.16.140. The report shall be filed in the form of a paper		
76	original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the council, who shall forward electronic		
77	copies to all councilmembers; and		

- 78 B. The executive is requested to develop options to protect solar access for
- consideration in the 2012 Comprehensive Plan Update by March 1, 2012.
