1	A MOTION requesting that the executive develop and
2	transmit a report that reviews the potential impacts of the
3	upcoming auction of federally licensed broadcasting
4	frequencies on King County taxpayers, residents and
5	businesses.
6	WHEREAS, increasing demand for access to wireless connectivity poses a major
7	challenge to ensure that America's wireless networks have the capacity to support the
8	critical economic, public safety, health care and other activities that rely on them, and
9	WHEREAS, the radio spectrum is the range of frequencies used for wireless
10	applications including broadcast television and radio, cell phones, satellite radio and
11	television, wireless computer networks, Bluetooth, GPS and police dispatch, and
12	WHEREAS, in the United States, the National Telecommunications and
13	Information Administration governs federal government users of the radio spectrum and
14	the Federal Communications Commission ("the FCC") regulates all other users, and
15	WHEREAS, starting on March 29, 2016, the FCC will hold an auction, known as
16	"the Incentive Auction," as a means of repurposing the radio spectrum by encouraging
17	existing licensees to voluntarily relinquish spectrum usage rights in exchange for a share
18	of the proceeds from an auction of new licenses to use the repurposed spectrum, and

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19	WHEREAS, television stations operate under license from the federal government
20	and are required to broadcast "in the public interest," and
21	WHEREAS, local television news serves the public interest by providing real
22	time information in times of crisis, such as earthquake, wildfire, extreme weather and
23	civil unrest, and
24	WHEREAS, concerns have been raised that purchasers appear to have acquired
25	broadcast licenses following Congressional authorization of a spectrum auction to
26	position themselves for windfall profits from the resale of broadcast licenses rather than
27	from provision of public interest broadcasting, and
28	WHEREAS, concerns have been raised that the potential closure of hundreds of
29	local television stations as a result of the Incentive Auction is not in the public interest;
30	and
31	WHEREAS, the FCC should facilitate the reallocation of the television bandwidth
32	to allow the more efficient use of a publicly owned resource, and
33	WHEREAS, reallocation of the broadcast spectrum should maintain benefits to
34	taxpayers than to market speculators, and
35	WHEREAS, proceeds from the Incentive Auction should be reinvested in the
36	public interest;
37	NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
38	A. The executive shall develop and transmit to the council a report that reviews
39	the potential impacts of the upcoming Incentive Auction on King County taxpayers,
40	residents and businesses. At a minimum, the report shall include:

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41	1. Analysis of the impact of the Incentive Auction on county residents,
42	including the availability of public interest broadcasting;
43	2. Analysis by the office of emergency management of the disaster
44	coordination-related risks and impacts of the potential loss of spectrum for local
45	television;
46	3. Analysis of the fiscal impact of the Incentive Auction on county government
47	and residents;
48	4. A potential strategy to ensure equitable distribution of benefits from the
49	proceeds of the Incentive Auction; and
50	5. Recommended language for inclusion in the federal legislative agenda.
51	B. The executive shall transmit the report required in subsection A. of this motion
52	by March 25, 2016, in the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk
53	of the council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all

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- 54 councilmembers, the council chief of staff, the policy staff director and the lead staff for
- the government accountability and oversight committee, or its successor.
