4	WHEREAS, at the end of September	2016, the median single-family home price
5	in King County was nearly five hundred tho	usand dollars, more than three hundred
6	thousand dollars above the national median,	and
7	WHEREAS, King County home pric	es increased more than fourteen percent
8	between September 2015 and 2016, a rate of	fincrease more than double the national
9	average, and	
10	WHEREAS, at the end of September	2016, the median monthly rental price in
11	King County was two thousand two hundred	l fifty dollars, more than seven hundred
12	dollars above the national median, and	
13	WHEREAS, these housing price leve	els have resulted in nearly three hundred
14	thousand households in King County spendi	ng more than thirty percent of their incomes
15	on housing, and	
16	WHEREAS, far too many people ha	ve been unable to afford any type of housing,
17	with nearly ten thousand people experiencin	g homelessness on any given day during
18	2016, and	

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19	WHEREAS, during the third quarter of 2016, one thousand one hundred seventy-	
20	two homeless families applied to King County for permanent housing, and	
21	WHEREAS, the lack of affordable housing and the crisis of homelessness are	
22	being felt in every community in the county, and	
23	WHEREAS, King County, local jurisdictions, private and nonprofit partners and	
24	philanthropic organizations have come together to address the challenges of	
25	homelessness and housing affordability: through the efforts of All Home to make	
26	homelessness rare, brief and one-time; through the work of the King County consortium	
27	to assess community development and housing needs countywide and to allocate state	
28	and federal funding; and through the work of the growth management planning council to	
29	develop strategies to meet housing needs through local planning and zoning initiatives,

42	the mental illness and drug dependency levy, which includes supportive services for

44	WHEREAS, the King County council is working with regional partners to	
45	examine the possibility of submitting a proposal to the voters to renew the veterans and	
46	human services levy, which includes services and support for veterans and others in need	
47	in our community, and	
48	WHEREAS, the King County council has made difficult choices in its 2017-2018	
49	biennial budget to allocate an additional seven million five hundred thousand dollars to	
50	provide emergency shelter and services to those experiencing homelessness, joining	
51	communities around the region that are increasing local support to help those in need, and	
52	WHEREAS, even with these new resources, and despite the ongoing regional	
53	efforts, the magnitude of the housing and homelessness challenge facing this region	
54	requires a more intensive and coordinated regional approach;	
55	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:	
56	A. The King County council, working in coordination with the King County	
57	executive, will convene a regional planning effort during 2017 that includes cities,	
58	nonprofit agencies and private partners to develop a regional plan for affordable housing.	
59	B. The regional planning effort will lead to a plan that includes identification of	
60	the roles of the participating partners and others, data collection efforts, funding needs,	
61	strategies and recommendations for action. The regional planning effort will incorporate	
62	and build upon the significant planning and efforts already underway in many	
63	jurisdictions.	
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C. As part of this regional effort, the King County council will work with the
King County executive and regional partners to explore the affordable housing funding
authority provided to local governments by the Washington state Legislature in 2015
through RCW 82.14.530.

D. The King County council requests the King County executive to report on the
status of this effort by March 31, 2017. The report should be filed in the form of a paper

- original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the council, who shall retain the original
- 71 and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers.
