	Proposed No. 2017-0333.2 Sponsors Dembowski and Kohl-Welles
1	A MOTION expressing the council's support to explore
2	development of a transit function in the office of the
3	ombudsman to receive, investigate and help ressolve
4	complaints about transit and paratransit operations.
5	WHEREAS, King County Metro Transit operates a regional transit system that
6	provided more than one hundred twenty million boardings through three-and-a-half
7	million service hours in 2015, and
8	WHEREAS, King County Metro Transit, in compliance with the Americans with
9	Disabilities Act, includes as part of the transit system the Access paratransit service for
10	people whose disabilities prevent them from using the regular fixed route transit system,
11	and
12	WHEREAS, the Access paratransit service provided nearly nine hundred
13	thousand rides to more than eight thousand people during 2016 at a cost of sixty-one
14	million dollars, and
15	WHEREAS, in 2017, Ordinance 18449 adopted a long-range plan for Metro
16	Transit that focused around strategies to provide additional frequent, express, local and
17	flexible transit services by 2040, including improvements to Access paratransit, and
18	WHEREAS, it is the shared goal of the executive and council that Metro Transit
19	services are efficient and cost-effective and that these services appropriately and reliably

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20	meet the diverse needs of the traveling public, and
21	WHEREAS, people with disabilities and advocacy organizations that work on
22	behalf of people with disabilities have expressed concerns with the current operations of
23	Access paratransit and its ability to reliably meet the transportation needs of people with
24	disabilities, and
25	WHEREAS, the council intends to make improvements to Access paratransit, but
26	also intends to provide a more effective and efficient way for all transit riders, including
27	people with disabilities, to express concerns about transit service and to have those
28	concerns investigated;
29	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
30	A. The council expresses its support to explore development of a transit function
31	in the office of the ombudsman to receive, investigate and help resolve complaints about
32	transit and paratransit operations.
33	B. The ombudsman is requested to present to the chair of the King County
34	council by September 15, 2017, a proposal to implement a transit function within the
35	office of the ombudsman beginning in January 2018. The proposal should include a
36	request for any needed increased staff and budget, a proposed timeline for
37	implementation of the new function and a description of how members of the public,
38	including people with disabilities, will be alerted to the presence of the new function.
39	The proposal should be presented to the chair of the council in the form of a
40	memorandum, with copies also presented by the ombudsman to the chair of the

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- 41 transportation, economy and environment committee, the chief of staff and the director of
- 42 legislative services.
