1 A MOTION relating to the organization of the council;
2 amending the expiration date of the council's special
3 committee on alternatives to incarceration; amending
4 Motion 11122, Section D, as amended, and OR 2-020.

5 WHEREAS, the King County Charter provides that the council "shall be
6 responsible for its own organization," and

7 WHEREAS, the council desires to extend the sunset date of its special committee
8 on alternatives to incarceration.

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

10 I. Motion 11122, Section D, as amended, and OR 2-020 are each hereby amended
11 to read as follows:

12 **Standing committees - functions.** In addition to any committee otherwise
13 established by law, the committees of the metropolitan King County council and their
14 respective functions are established as follows:

15 A. **Budget and fiscal management committee** shall consider and make
16 recommendations on: the county revenue and expenditure fiscal structural gap; capital
17 and operating budget appropriations; the sale and lease of real property to or by the
18 county; debt and investment proposals; bond issues; the office of economic and financial
19 analysis; and financial policies. The committee shall also consider the implementation of

20 appropriate labor agreements.

21 1. The committee shall develop recommendations on policy direction for the
22 biennial budget, based on the recommendations of other council committees and taking
23 into account the estimated fiscal impacts of state and federal legislation.

24 2. In respect to consideration of the county's proposed biennial budget, all
25 members of the council not assigned to the budget and fiscal management committee
26 shall be considered ex officio voting members of the committee.

27 **B. Government accountability and oversight committee.**

28 1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on:

29 a. improving the efficiency, cost effectiveness and performance of all branches
30 of county government (legislative, executive and judicial);

31 b. enhancing oversight, accountability and transparency in King County
32 government, the annual county audit program and federal, state or county audit reports,
33 the administration of the Public Records Act, civil rights and compliance, capital projects
34 oversight, strategic planning, performance measurement and performance management,
35 management organizational structure and technology management; and

36 c. general government oversight, including customer service, worker safety,
37 the department of assessments; elections; records and licensing; animal control; cable
38 communications; the county fair; King County international airport; risk management;
39 veterans, and executive services such as telecommunications, facilities management,
40 purchasing and real property management.

41 2. In the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall track state
42 and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the

43 biennial budget.

44 **C. Health, housing and human services committee.**

45 1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating
46 to:

47 a. public health programs, including those related to the protection, promotion
48 and provision functions of the department of public health, including the structure of the
49 public health centers;

50 b. affordable housing, including therapeutic and low-income housing ; and

51 c. human services programs, including review of human services-related

52 levies, and civil rights and social justice. The committee shall also consider the
53 implementation of appropriate labor agreements.

54 2. In the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall track state
55 and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the
56 biennial budget.

57 **D. Law and justice committee.**

58 1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating
59 to law, safety, criminal justice and emergency management programs, excluding those
60 related to alternatives to incarceration and including those related to: public safety; adult
61 detention; juvenile justice and youth services; superior and district courts; judicial
62 administration; prosecuting attorney; public defense; implementation of a pretrial risk
63 assessment tool; emergency medical services; emergency management, including disaster
64 response, emergency preparedness and emergency planning and the Puget Sound
65 emergency radio network project.

66 2. In the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall track state
67 and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the
68 biennial budget.

69 **E. Transportation, economy and environment committee.**

70 1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating
71 to:

72 a. growth management, including land use development and regulation,
73 comprehensive planning, including implementation of its affordable housing elements,
74 economic development, including pay equity and income disparity, and annexations;

75 b. the environment, including: salmon recovery; resource lands; energy;
76 surface water management and water supply; wastewater treatment; unincorporated and
77 rural areas, including agriculture and rural services; and parks, recreation and cultural
78 resources; and

79 c. transportation, including roads, passenger ferries and public transportation.

80 The committee shall also consider the implementation of appropriate labor agreements.

81 2. In the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall track state
82 and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the
83 biennial budget.

84 **F. Special committee on alternatives to incarceration.**

85 1. There is established a special committee on alternatives to incarceration.


86 2. The special committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies
87 related to alternatives to incarceration such as electronic home detention, work education
88 release or successor programs.

89 3. The special committee shall complete its tasks ((as of ~~December 31, 2017,~~
90 ~~and as of that date, in accordance with K.C.C. 1.24.010.E.,~~) by June 30, 2018. On July
91 1, 2018, the special committee shall expire.

County Council on 1/22/2018, by the following vote:


