1 A MOTION confirming the executive's appointment of the
2 members of the King County children and families strategy
3 task force in accordance with Motion 15521.

4 WHEREAS, Motion 15521 established the King County children and families
5 strategy task force to explore policy recommendations related to child care affordability
6 and access in King County, and

7 WHEREAS, the children and families strategy task force will be tasked with
8 preparing a report that makes recommendations for addressing access and affordability
9 issues related to child care in King County, and

10 WHEREAS, the members of the task force shall be appointed by the executive
11 and confirmed by the council, and

12 WHEREAS, the county executive has appointed the following members to the
