MOTION NO. 63301

A MOTION requesting the United States Army Corps of Engineers to complete a study of the White (or Stuck) and Puyallup Rivers flooding problems to be followed by corrections of the problems initiated under the jurisdiction of the Corps of Engineers as soon as possible thereafter.

WHEREAS, King and Pierce Counties entered into an Inter-County River Improvement agreement in 1914 to assist in controlling the flooding on the White (or Stuck) and Puyallup Rivers, and

WHEREAS, the Corps of Engineers has built two projects to assist in controlling flooding along the White (or Stuck) and the lower Puyallup Rivers, namely, Mud Mountain Dam on the White River near Enumclaw, completed in 1953, and channel and levee improvements along the lower Puyallup River near Tacoma, completed in 1950, and

WHEREAS, the Corps of Engineers under authority of a resolution the United States Senate Public Works Committee adopted May, 1968 began investigations on the Puyallup River in 1970 which resulted in a November, 1972 Flood Control Study of the Puyallup River and its tributaries with detailed attention to solutions at Orting, and

WHEREAS, the overall study of the Puyallup River and its tributaries ceased before completion in 1975 due to a lack of appropriations by Congress, and

WHEREAS, the interests and legal requirements of those interests involved in this river area have blocked major action to solve the gravel sedimentation in the river area, namely:

- 1. The Court decisions on Indian lands and rivers affecting the White River through the Muckleshoot Indian Reservation.
 - 2. The Department of Fisheries
 - 3. The Department of Game
 - 4. The Department of Ecology

- Puget Sound Power and Light with its White River 9. Project consisting of a low diversion dam near Buckley, a series of flumes, canals and settling basins leading to Lake Tapps, and a powerhouse located near Dieringer, and,

WHEREAS, the Inter-County River Improvement Agreement (ICRI) between King and Pierce Counties resulted in major construction works between 1914 and 1921 with provisions for ICRI employees to maintain the channel and related works thereafter, and

WHEREAS, due to many problems, such as noted below, the ICRI has informed the U.S. Corps of Engineers that they would no longer be able to maintain the channel capacity as agreed prior to the construction of the Mud Mountain Dam, namely:

- Lack of state matching funds,
- Funding for necessary local projects has become more 2. difficult due to other county needs,
- The Muckelshoot Tribe Access Agreement has stopped all work on the White River bordering the Muckleshoot Reservation,
- Permit requirements by many agencies have restricted the ICRI's ability to perform the necessary maintenance of the channel.
- Projects have been delayed due to the lack of the ICRI schedules for channel maintenance operations to coincide with low flow periods, and
- Negotiations with the Department of Natural Resources over gravel royalties for removal of the gravel bar in the White (or Stuck) River near Pacific, where two young girls were drowned on July 15, 1976, have delayed its removal, and

WHEREAS, Congress is working on an appropriation for the

U.S. Armey Corps of Engineers to fund an evaluation of the proposed solutions to these problems.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The United States Army Corps of Engineers is hereby requested to complete a study of the White (or Stuck) and Puyallup Rivers flooding problems with an evaluation of the alternative possible solutions, which will serve as a basis for correcting the problems to be initiated under the U.S. Corps of Engineers' jurisdiction as soon as possible after the completion of the study.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED,

A copy of this motion be sent to the Washington, D.C. and Seattle offices of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, to the Pierce County Commissioners and Senator Warren G. Magnuson's office in Seattle and Washington, D.C.
