An ordinance relating to the public health, safety and welfare; establishing an on-the-job training program and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Public Law 89-754 enacted by the 89th Congress November 3, 1966, has declared the following purpose:

"...to provide additional financial and technical assistance to enable cities of all sizes to plan develop and carry out locally prepared and scheduled comprehensive city demonstration programs containing new and imaginative proposals to rebuild or revitalize large slum and blighted areas; to expand housing, job and income opportunities; to reduce dependance on welfare payments; to to combat disease and ill health; to reduce incidence of crime and delinquency; to enhance recreational and cultural opportunities; to establish better access between homes and jobs; and generally to improve living conditions for the people in such areas, and to accomplish these objectives through the most effective and economical concentration and coordination of federal, state and local public and private efforts to improve the quality of urban life."

and;

WHEREAS, the implementation of such purposes appears to be proper public and private purpose within the area of a county's operation; and,

WHEREAS, in King County certain conditions have exisited and continue to exist, depriving certain residents of certain areas of the county of equal opportunity for gainful occupation, and inparticular those living in areas designated as Model Neighborhoods; and,

WHEREAS, the adverse effects and results of such handicap upon the community and the state as a whole are manifest and have been experienced in various parts of the nation and in King County and an emergency appears to exist; NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the County Council of King County, Washington, in the excercise of its powers for the health, safety and welfare of its citizens, a policy and program as follows:

Section 1. To assist in providing employment and training opportunities for those residents of King County who are in need and who are handicapped in the seeking of such training or employment by reason of discrimination on account of race, creed, color and national origin;

Section 1. (a) The County Executive shall be authorized to enter into appropriate contracts with other governmental agencies including but not limited to the City of Seattle, in connection with its Model Cities Program, or with private contractors, or both, to provide services as may be appropriate or necessary to effectuate this policy, including but not limited to on-the-job training of qualified applicants in County projects.

Section 2. Motion Number 95 of the King County Council is hereby ratified and incorporated into this ordinance, and all

acts and contracts previously done or made by any officer or employee of King County pursuant thereto are hereby ratified. Section 3. The County Council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, and for the support of County government and its existing institutions.
