## ORDINANCE NO. CO159

## AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE FORM TO BE USED FOR REFERENDUM AND INITIATIVE PETITIONS

WHEREAS, the Home Rule Charter for King County provides that the Council shall establish by Ordinance the form to be used for Referendum and Initiative Petitions,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL:

Section 1: General Requirements

9 Persons proposing referendum and initiative measures 10 may, after compliance with Sections 4, 5 and 6 of this Ordinance, 11 prepare blank petitions and cause them to be printed upon single 12 sheets of white paper of good quality, eight-and-one-half inches 13 in width and thirteen inches in length, with a margin of one-and-14 three-quarters inches at the top for binding. Each petition shall 15 consist of not more than five sheets with numbered lines for not 16 more than twenty signatures on each sheet, with the prescribed 17 title and form of petition on each sheet, and, if appropriate un-18 der Section 8 of this Ordinance, a full, true and correct copy of 19 the proposed measure referred to therein printed on sheets of pa-20 per of like size and quality as the petition, firmly fastened to-21 gether.

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Sec. 2: Filing a Proposed Measure with Clerk of Council If any individual, or committee of individuals desires to petition the council to enact a proposed measure or to order that a referendum of any ordinance passed by the council be submitted to the electorate, he shall file in the office of the Clerk of the Council five printed or typewritten copies of the measure proposed or on which a referendum is desired, accompanied by the name and post office address of the proposer.

Sec. 3: Time for filing Initiative Petitions Initiative Petitions containing the required signatures of registered voters of the county as provided in Section 230.50

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of the Charter, must be filed within sixty(60) days from the date 1 of approval of such form by the clerk of the council. If petition-2 er fails to file such petition within the prescribed time limit, it 3 shall have no validity and the petition will not be considered by 4 the council as an initiative petition. 5

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Numbering - Transmittal to Department of Sec. 4: Records and Elections

The Clerk of the Council shall assign a Serial Number 8 to each initiative or referendum measure, using a separate series 9 for each, and forthwith transmit one copy of the measure proposed, 10 bearing its serial number, to the Department of Records and Elec-11 tions. Thereafter a measure shall be known and designated on all 12 petitions, ballots and proceedings as "Initiative Measure No.\_ or "Referendum Measure No.\_\_\_\_".

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Ballot Title - Formulation by Department of Sec. 5: Records and Elections

Within five(5) days after the receipt of an initiative 17 or referendum measure the Department of Records and Elections shall 18 formulate therefor and transmit to the Clerk of the Council a 19 statement of not to exceed one hundred words, bearing the serial 20 number of the measure. The statement may be distinct from the Petitioner's title of the measure, and shall express, and give a true and impartial statement of the purpose of the measure; it shall not be intentionally an argument, nor likely to create prejudice, either for or against the measure. In addition to such statement, the Department of Records and Elections shall also prepare a caption, not to exceed five words in length, to permit the voters readily to identify the initiative or referendum measure and distinguish it from other questions on the ballot. This caption and the statement together shall constitute the ballot title. The ballot title formulated by the Department of Records and Elections shall be the ballot title of the measure.

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Sec. 6: Ballot title - Notice to proponents 1 2 Upon the filing of the ballot title for an initiative or referendum measure in that office, the Department of Records 3 and Elections shall forthwith notify the persons proposing the 4 5 measure, by mail, of the exact language thereof.
