

ORDINANCE  
NO. 1006

71-651

AN ORDINANCE relating to the codification of the ordinances and resolutions of King County amending Sections 1, 2(B) and (E) and 11, Resolution 8778; Sections 1(B) and 2(II), Resolution 24834 and Sections 2, 3 and 5, Resolution 6894.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Section 1, Resolution 8778 is amended to read as follows:

This chapter shall be known as the "King County ((Garbage)) Solid Waste Code", and shall be operative in King County outside of the corporate limits of the incorporated cities and towns ((and-shall-be-deemed-to-be-the-exercise-of-authority-vested-in-the County-Commissioners,-as-outlined-in-the-State-Constitution,-and the-laws-of-the-State-of-Washington)), and shall be for the preservation and protection of public health, peace and safety. The terms, provisions, rules and regulations incorporated herein, shall be liberally construed for the aforementioned purpose.

SECTION 2. Section 2(B) and (E), Resolution 8778 are amended to read as follows:

(B) HEALTH OFFICER, for the purpose of this chapter, shall mean the King County ((Health-Officer)) Director of Public Health or his authorized agent.

(E) SANITARIAN, for the purpose of this chapter, shall mean any of the assistants to the Chief Sanitarian who are responsible for the inspection or enforcement of the rules and regulations, as adopted in the King County ((Garbage)) Solid Waste Code.

SECTION 3. Section 11, Resolution 8778 is amended to read as follows:

((The-Board-of-County-Commissioners)) The County Council may establish or authorize the use of sanitary fills, by licensing or otherwise, to persons in the business of collecting garbage or to incorporated cities and towns.

1 SECTION 4. Section 1(B), Resolution 24834 is amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 (B) DIRECTOR--The term "director" for the purpose of this  
4 chapter shall mean the director of the ((King-County-sanitary  
5 operations-department)) Department of Public Works and Transportation  
6 or his authorized representative.

7 SECTION 5. Section 2(H), Resolution 24834 is amended to read  
8 as follows:

9 Appeal. Any registration and inspection certificates issued  
10 under this chapter may be suspended by the director or revoked for  
11 cause after an opportunity for a hearing by the director; provided  
12 further, however, than an appeal may be taken to the ((Board-of  
13 County-Commissioners)) County Council from the order of the  
14 director revoking or suspending any such certificates. Any appeal  
15 shall be taken within ten days from the date of the issuance of the  
16 order by serving a copy of a written notice thereof stating the  
17 grounds for said appeal, on the director and filing the original  
18 with the clerk of the ((Board-of-County-Commissioners)) Council.

19 SECTION 6. Section 2, Resolution 6894 is amended to read as  
20 follows:

21 Each person desiring to make an application to collect and  
22 haul garbage shall make such application to the ((Board-of-County  
23 Commissioners)) Solid Waste Division, Department of Public Works  
24 and Transportation and the same shall then be referred to the King  
25 County Health Officer, who shall investigate the districts in which  
26 the person desires to operate and determine if such person has  
27 proper equipment, including trucks to render proper service for  
28 such district, and the County Health Officer shall further inspect  
29 the proposed fills or incinerators, or other method of disposition  
30 of garbage proposed by such person and report to the ((Board-of  
31 County-Commissioners)) County Council his approval or disapproval  
32 of the method proposed.

1 SECTION 7. Section 3, Resolution 6894 is amended to read as  
2 follows:

3 If, after receiving the report of the County Health Officer,  
4 the ((Board)) Council deems it proper to issue a license to the  
5 applicant, such license shall be issued upon the payment of one  
6 hundred dollars license fee for each year, or part thereof, and  
7 upon the posting by such person with the ((Board-of-County-Commis-  
8 sioners)) Department of Public Works and Transportation of a  
9 performance bond in the principal sum of one thousand dollars  
10 executed by a surety company licensed to do business within the  
11 State of Washington, which bond shall run to King County and shall  
12 be conditioned that the licensee will collect garbage at least once  
13 a week from all private residences and at least twice a week from  
14 all business properties with whom such licensee has contracted for  
15 the collection of garbage and will not violate any regulation made  
16 by the ((Board-of-County-Commissioners)) County Council or promul-  
17 gated by the State Health Department and will haul garbage only to  
18 approved sanitary fills or incinerators.

19 SECTION 8. Section 5, Resolution 6894 is amended to read as  
20 follows:

21 The licensee is required to conform to all rules and  
22 regulations of the State Board of Health and to any rules or  
23 regulations enacted by the ((Board-of-County-Commissioners))  
24 County Council.
