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AN ORDINANCE relating to the codification of the ordinances and resolutions of King County, amending Section 42 (a) and (b), Resolution 28232 and Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4, Resolution 35544.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Section 42 (a) and (b), Resolution 28232 are amended to read as follows:

- (a) There is hereby established a Boating Advisory Commission composed of such members as may be selected by the ((Board-of-King County-Commissioners)) County Executive and approved by the County Council.
- (b) The Boating Advisory Commission shall recommend to the ((Board-of-King-County-Commissioners)) County Council ways and means for improving boating conditions. The Commission shall meet upon the call of the Chairman.

SECTION 2. Section 1, Resolution 35544 is amended to read as follows:

The ((chairman-of-the-board-of-county-commissioners,-or-if-he is-unavailable,-any-other-available-commissioner,)) county executive shall proclaim in writing the existence of a civil emergency, when it appears under existing circumstances that riot, unlawful assembly, insurrection, or the imminent threat thereof occur within the confines of King County and result in, or threaten to result in, the death or injury of persons, or the destruction of property to such extent as to require, in his judgment, extraordinary measures to protect the public peace, safety and welfare.

SECTION 3. Section 2, Resolution 35544 is amended to read as follows:

Upon the proclamation of a civil emergency by the ((chairman of-the-board-of-county-commissioners,-or-such-other-members-of-the board-of-county-commissioners-as-may-be-available,)) County

Executive and during the existence of such civil emergency, ((the chairman)) he may make and proclaim any or all of the following orders:

- (b) An order requiring any or all business establishments to close and remain closed until further order;
- (c) An order requiring the closure of any or all bars, taverns liquor stores and other business establishments where alcoholic beverages are sold or otherwise dispensed; provided that with respect to those business establishments which are not primarily devoted to the sale of alcoholic beverages, and in which such alcoholic beverages may be removed or made secure from possible seizure by the public, the portions thereof utilized for the sale of items other than alcoholic beverages may, in his discretion, be allowed to remain open;
- (d) An order requiring the discontinuance of sale, distribution or giving away of alcoholic beverages in any or all parts of the county;
- (e) An order requiring the closure of any or all business establishments where firearms and/or ammunition for firearms are sold or otherwise dispensed; provided that with respect to those business establishments which are not primarily devoted to the sale of firearms and/or ammunition and in which such firearms and/or ammunition may be removed or made secure from possible seizure by the public, the portions thereof utilized for the sale of items other than firearms and/or ammunition may, in his discretion, be allowed to remain open;
- (f) An order requiring the discontinuance of the sale, distribution or giving away of firearms and/or ammunition for firearms in any or all parts of the county;

- (g) An order prohibiting the carrying or possession of firearms or any instrument which is capable of inducing bodily harm, provided that any such order shall not apply to peace officers or military personnel engaged in the performance of their official duties;
- (h) An order requiring the discontinuance of the sale, distribution or giving away of gasoline or other liquid, flammable or combustible products in any container (other than a gasoline tank properly fixed to a motor vehicle);
- (i) An order closing to the public any and all public places, including streets, alleys, public ways, schools, parks, beaches, amusement areas, and public buildings;
- (j) Such other orders as are imminently necessary for the protection of life and property.

SECTION 4. Section 3, Resolution 35544 is amended to read as follows:

Any orders proclaimed pursuant to Section 2 above, shall, at the earliest practicable time, be presented to the ((board-of-county commissioners)) County Council for ratification and confirmation and if not so ratified and confirmed shall be void.

SECTION 5. Section 4, Resolution 35544 is amended to read as follows:

The ((chairman-of-the-board-of-county-commissioners,-or such-other-commissioner-as-shall-be-available,)) County Executive shall cause any proclamation issued by him pursuant to the authority of this chapter to be delivered to all news media within
