AN ORDINANCE providing for an additional appropriation in the 1971 King County Budget, Part 2 (Capital Improvement Budget) for the Federal Aviation Agency Northwest Regional Headquarters Building, such funds being derived from the Airport Construction Fund.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL:

Section 1. The County Council finds that King County Airport urgently requires a capital appropriation in the amount of \$85,000 for the design and administration of the Federal Aviation Agency Northwest Regional Headquarters Building.

Section 2. The County Council finds that uncommitted funds from the Airport Construction Fund may be used for the design and administration of the building, the use of such funds being governed by the provisions of Ordinance No. 964.

Section 3. That pursuant to the above findings, the County Council hereby approves and adopts an additional capital appropriation, subject to the provisions of Section 470.30 of the King County Charter, in the amount of \$85,000 and declares that said appropriation of uncommitted funds from the Airport Construction Fund for the purpose enumerated in Section 1 herein is consistent with the provisions of Ordinance No. 964.

Section 4. The County Executive or his designee is hereby authorized to make or cause to have made the necessary adjustments to the 1971 King County Budget, Part 2 (Capital Improvement Budget) within the section identified therein pertaining to the Airport Construction Fund as required by the provisions of Section 3 above.

Section 5. The County Council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and this ordinance is necessary for the immediate

preservation of public peace, health and safety, and for the support of the County government and its existing institutions.
