## 03DIHANO NO. 1058

AN ORDINANCE granting Emergency Powers to The King County Executive in event of an enemy attack upon the United States, civil disturbance, riot, sabotage, or major natural disaster; repealing Res. 35544 and Section 2, 3, 4 and 5, Ordinance 1008 and K.C.C. 12.52; and prescribing penalties.

NEW SECTION SECTION 1. (a) "Civil Defense" means the preparation for and the coordination of all emergency functions other than functions for which the military forces are primarily responsible, to minimize and repair injury and damage resulting from disasters caused by enemy attack, sabotage, or other hostile action, or by civil disturbance, riot, fire, flood, storm, earthquake, or other natural causes, and to provide support for search and rescue operations for persons and property in distress. These functions include, without limitation, fire fighting services, police services, medical and health services, rescue, engineering, air raid warning services, communications, radiological, chemical and other special weapons defense, evacuation of persons from stricken areas, emergency walfare services, emergency transportation, existing or properly assigned functions of plant protection, temporary restoration of public utility services and other functions related to civilian protection, together with all other activities necessary or incidental to the preparation for and the coordination of the foregoing functions.

- (b) "Civil Defense worker" means any person who is registered with a state or local civil defense organization for the purpose of engaging in authorized civil defense service or is an employee of the State of Washington or any political subdivision thereof who is called upon to perform civil defense service.
- (c) "Civil Defense service" means and includes all activities authorized by and carried on pursuant to the provisions of the Washington State Civil Defense Act of 1951, RCW 38.52, including training necessary or proper to engage in such activities.
- (d) "Injury" as used in this Ordinance shall mean and include sccidental injuries and/or occupational diseases arising out of civil defense service.

NEW SECTION SECTION 2. (a) Because of the existing and increasing possibility of the occurrence of disasters of unprecedented size and destructiveness resulting from enemy attack, sabotage, or other hostile action, riot, civil disturbance, or from fire, flood, storm, earthquake, or other natural causes, and in order to insure that preparations of King County will be adequate to deal with such disasters, and further to insure adequate support for search and rescue operations, and generally to provide for the common defense and to protect the public peace, health, and safety, and to preserve the lives and property of the people of King County, it is hereby found and declared to be necessary:

- (1) To confer upon the King County Executive the emergency powers provided herein;
- (2) To provide for the rendering of mutual aid among the political subdivisions of King County and with other adjoining counties and to cooperate with the State of Washington and the Federal Government with respect to the carrying out of civil defense functions; and
- (3) To provide a means of compensating civil defense workers who may suffer any injury as defined by RCW 38.52 as a result of participation in civil defense service.

NEW SECTION SECTION 3. The King County Executive shall see that the Washington State Laws and Ordinances of King County are enforced, and shall direct and control all subordinate officers of the County, except insofar as such enforcement, direction and control is by King County Charter reposed in some other officer or board, and shall maintain the peace and order in King County.

(a) Whenever an enemy attack is made against the United States or other major national disaster, or earthquake, volcano eruption, flood, fire, sabotage, civil disturbance, riot, unlawful assembly, or insurrection, or the imminent threat thereof, occur in King County and result in the death or injury of persons or the destruction of property to such extent as to require, in the judgment of the King County Executive, extraordinary measures to protect the public peace, safety and welfare, the King County Executive may forthwith proclaim in writing the existence of such an emergency.

- (b) Upon the proclamation of an emergency by the King County Executive, and during the existence of such emergency, the King County Executive may make and proclaim any or all of the following orders:
- (1) An order recalling King County employees from vacation, cancelling days off, authorizing overtime, recalling selected retired employees, and the emergency procurement of supplies and equipment without formal bidding procedures.
- (2) An order directing the evacuation and to clear debris and wreckage resulting from a major disaster from publicly and privately owned lands and waters.
- (3) An order imposing a general curfew applicable to King County as a whole, or to such geographical area or areas of King County and during such hours, as he deems necessary, and from time to time to modify the hours such curfew will be in effect and the area or areas to which it will apply.
- (4) An order requiring any or all business establishments to close and remain closed until further order.
- (5) An order requiring the closure of any and all bars, taverns, liquor stores, and other business establishments where alcoholic beverages are sold or otherwise dispensed; provided that with respect to those business establishments which are not primarily devoted to the sale of alcoholic beverages and in which such alcoholic beverages may be removed or made secure from possible seizure by the public; the portions thereof utilized for the sale of items other than alcoholic beverages may, in the discretion of the King County Executive, be allowed to remain open.
- (6) An order requiring the discontinuance of the sale, distribution or giving away of alcoholic beverages in any or all parts of King County.
- (7) An order requiring the discontinuance of the sale, distribution or giving away of firearms and/or ammunition for firearms in any or all parts of King County.
- (8) An order requiring the discontinuance of the sale, distribution or giving away of gasoline or other liquid flammable or combustible products in any container other than a gasoline tank properly affixed to a motor vehicle.
  - (9) An order requiring the closure of any or all business establishments

- (b) Upon the proclamation of an emergency by the King County Executive, and during the existence of such emergency, the King County Executive may make and proclaim any or all of the following orders:

  - (9) An order requiring the closure of any or all business establishments

where firearms and/or ammunition for firearms are sold or otherwise dispensed; provided that with respect to those business establishments which are not primarily devoted to the sale of firearms and/or ammunition and in which such firearms and/or ammunition may be removed or made secure from possible seizure by the public, the portions thereof utilized for the sale of items other than firearms and ammunition may, in the discretion of the King County Executive, be allowed to remain open.

- (10) An order closing to the public any or all public places including streets, alleys, public ways, schools, parks, beaches, amusement areas and public buildings.
- instrument which is capable of producing bodily harm and which is carried or possessed with intent to use the same to cause such harm, provided that any such order shall not apply to peace officers or military personnel engaged in the performance of their official duties.
- (12) Such other orders as are imminently necessary for the protection of life and property; provided, however, that any such orders shall, at the earliest practicable time, be presented to the King County Council for ratification or confirmation, and if not so ratified and confirmed shall be void.
- (c) The King County Executive shall cause any proclamation issued by him pursuant to the authority of this ordinance to be delivered to all news media within King County and shall utilize such other available means, including public address systems, as shall be necessary in his judgment, to give notice of such proclamation to the public.
- (d) It is unlawful for anyone to fail or refuse to obey any such order proclaimed by the King County Executive. Anyone convicted of a violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment for not more than one hundred eighty (180) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- (e) This Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and the support and preservation of public agencies of King County, and shall take effect immediately.
