## ORDINANCE NO. 1886

AN ORDINANCE relating to current use assessments on open space, farm and agricultural, and timber land and implementing the 1973 amendments to RCW Chapter 84.34; amending and adding new sections to Ordinance 1076 and KCC Chapter 20.36.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Section 1, Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36.010 is amended to read as follows:

purpose AND INTENT. It is in the best interest of the county to maintain, preserve, conserve and otherwise continue in existence adequate open space lands for the production of food, fiber and forest crops, and to assure the use and enjoyment of natural resources and scenic beauty for the economic and social well-being of the county and its citizens.

It is the intent of this ordinance to implement Chapter 84.34, RCW, as amended, by establishing procedures, rules and fees for the consideration of applications for current use assessment on "open space land," "farm and agricultural land," and "timber land" as those lands are defined in RCW 84.34.020.

The provisions of Chapter 84.34, RCW, and the regulations adopted thereunder shall govern the matters not expressly covered in this ordinance.

SECTION 2. Section 2, Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36.020

Section 3, Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36.030 SECTION 3. is amended to read as follows:

APPLICATIONS. An owner of farm and agricultural land desiring current use assessment under RCW Chapter 84.34 ((this ordinance)) shall make application to the county assessor and an owner of open space or timber land desiring current use assessment shall make application to the county council by filing an application with the county land use management division, department of community and environmental development. ((by-filing-application forms-with-the-department-of-planning.)) Said application shall be upon forms ((prepared-by-the-State-Bepartment-of-Revenue)) supplied by the county and shall include such information deemed reasonably necessary ((by-the-department-of-planning)) to properly classify an area of land under RCW Chapter 84.34 ((this-ordinance)) with a notarized verification of the truth thereof.

SECTION 4. Section 4, Ordinance 1076 and Kcc 20.36.040 is amended to read as follows:

((ene-hundred-dollars-for-twenty-neres-or-less-and-an-additional ene-dollar-for-each-acre-over-twenty-provided-that-no-application shall-contain-more-than-sim-hundred-forty-acres)) thirty dollars (\$30.00), payable to the King County Office of Finance, for each open space, farm and agricultural, or timber land, application filed in calendar year 1973 or thereafter: Provided, That if the application is not approved, then the fee shall be returned to the applicant.

(b) In the case of all farm and agricultural land applications, whether the application is based on land within or outside of an incorporated area, the entire fee shall be collected and retained by the county. In the case of open space or timber land applications based on land in an incorporated area of the county, where the city legislative authority has set no filing fee, the county fee shall govern and the entire fee shall be collected and retained by the county. Where the city legislative authority has established a filing fee for open space or timber land applications based on land in an incorporated area of the county, a single fee of thirty dollars (\$30.00) shall be collected by the county from the applicant and the county shall pay the city one-half of the fee collected: Provided, That in no event shall the amount paid to the city exceed the fee established

cultural or timber land applications made during the first four calendar months of 1973, that portion of the filing fee in excess of thirty dollars (\$30.00) paid pursuant to Ordinance 1076 shall be refunded to the applicant in every case where the application has not been approved or disapproved by the county council prior to July 16, 1973.

SECTION 5. Section 5, Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36.050 is amended to read as follows:

TIME TO FILE. Applications shall be made by <u>December</u>

31 ((during-the-first-feur-calendar-months)) of the calendar year preceding that <u>year</u> in which such classification is to begin.

SECTION 6. Section 6, Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36.060 is amended to read as follows:

APPLICATIONS IN UNINCORPORATED AREAS. When it is found that an open space or timber land application based on land in unincorporated areas of the county meets the filing requirements of the land use management division ((department-of-planning)) and the rules of the State Department of Revenue and the examiner, it shall be accepted and a date assigned for public hearing. Before rendering a recommendation on any such application, the examiner shall hold at least one public hearing thereon.

SECTION 7. Section 7, Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36.070 is amended to read as follows:

APPLICATIONS. Notice of the time, place and purpose of any such public hearing on an open space or timber land application based on land in unincorporated areas of the county shall be given by one publication in the official county newspaper at least ten ((twenty)) days before the hearing.

SECTION 8. Section 8, Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36.080 is amended to read as follows:

PHANNING. When such open space or timber land application based on land in unincorporated areas of the county has been set for public hearing, the land use management division ((department of-planning)) shall review the application to determine its conformance to the comprehensive plan and Chapter 84.34, RCW, ((and-this-chapter,)) and shall prepare a report summarizing the factors involved and ((the-department-of-planning)) its findings and recommendation. At least seven days prior to the scheduled hearing the report shall be filed with the examiner and copies thereof shall be mailed to the applicant and shall be made available for use by any interested party.

SECTION 9. Section 9, Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36.090 is amended to read as follows:

deputy examiner, in the case of open space and timber land applications based on land in unincorporated areas of the county, shall examine available information, conduct public hearings and prepare a record thereof, and prepare reports of recommendation to the county council for the approval or disapproval of said applications.

The examiner may recommend that the council approve the application with such conditions, modifications and restrictions as the examiner finds necessary to make the application carry out the goals and policies of the King County comprehensive plan and chapter 84.34, RCW ((and-this-chapter.)) In the case of applications filed after October 1 of each calendar year the examiner shall establish time periods for satisfaction of any conditions so as to enable the county assessor to make a timely notation on the assessment list and the tax roll for such land in the event of approval of such applications.

by the county assessor of applications for current use assessments on farm and agricultural land, shall examine available information, conduct public hearings and prepare a record thereof and prepare reports of recommendation to the county council for the approval or disapproval of said appealed applications, based upon RCW Chapter 84.34.

SECTION 10. There is added to Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36 a new section to read as follows:

NEW SECTION. OPEN SPACE AND TEMBER LAND APPLICATIONS TH INCORPORATED AREAS.

- (a) In the case of open space and timber land applications received by the county based on land in incorporated areas of the county, the land use management division shall promptly transmit a copy of said application to the affected city.
- (b) Such an application shall be acted upon by a determining authority composed of three county council members designated by the county council and three city council members designated by the applicable city legislative body. The application shall be acted upon after a public hearing and after notice of the hearing shall have been given by one publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the area at least ten days before the hearing.

SECTION 11. There is added to Ordinance 1076 and MCC 20.36 a new section to read as follows:

NEW SECTION. ASSESSOR TO APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE

AGRICULTURAL APPLICATIONS. The county assessor shall approve
or disapprove all applications for farm and agricultural classification with due regard to all relevant evidence. These
applications shall be deemed to have been approved unless,
prior to the first of May of the year after such application was
mailed or delivered to the assessor, he shall notify the applicant
in writing to the extent to which the application is denied.

SECTION 12. There is added to Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36 a new section to read as follows:

NEW SECTION TIME LIMIT FOR FARM AND AGRICULTURAL APPEALS AND REMOVAL APPEALS.

- (a) An applicant for current use assessment of farm and agricultural land who receives notice in writing from the county assessor that his application has been denied may appeal such denial to the county council by filing a written appeal such the clerk of the county council within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the date of the assessor's written notice of denial.
- (b) An owner of classified land who receives notice in writing from the county assessor that all or a portion of such land has been removed from current use classification may appeal such removal to the county board of equalization by filing a written appeal with the clerk of the board of equalization within thirty (30) calendar days of the date of the assessor's written notice of removal.

SECTION 13. There is added to Ordinance 1076 and KCC 20.36 a new section to read as follows:

NEW SECTION. PENDING APPLICATIONS. All applications for current use assessments made to the county during the first four calendar months of 1973, which have not been approved or disapproved by the county council prior to July 16, 1973, shall be treated as applications made under RCW Chapter 84.34, as amended in 1973 by Chapter 212, Laws of 1973 Ex. Sess. The
