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ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE relating to Rules and Order of Business of the King County Council and amending Ordinance 1373, as amended by Ordinance 1802, and K.C.C. 1.24.

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. ORGANIZATION.

Ordinance 1373, Section 1 and K.C.C. 1.24.010 are amended to read as follows:

The Council shall elect a Chairman and Vice Chairman for a term of one year, to begin the second Monday of January, at which time the Council will reconstitute itself. In the temporary absence of the Chairman, the Vice Chairman shall perform the duties and responsibilities of the Chairman as imposed by this ordinance. In the event the ((Vice-Chairman-is-unable-to-act-as Chairman,-a-temporary-Chairman-shall-be-appointed)) Chairman is unable to serve the remainder of the term, a new Chairman shall be elected. In the event the Vice Chairman is unable to serve the remainder of the term, a new Chairman shall be elected.

SECTION 2. CHAIRMAN.

Ordinance 1373, Section 2 and K.C.C. 1.24.020 are amended to read as follows:

The Chairman shall have the general direction of Council property and supervision of legislative branch employees except personal staff of council members, through the Council Adminitiator.

The Council Administrator shall report to the Chairman.

SECTION 3. MEETINGS.

Ordinance 1373, Section 3 and K.C.C. 1.24.030 are amended to read as follows:

The time of meeting of the Council shall be at nine-thirty

A.M. on Monday of each week, unless otherwise ordered by the

Council.

All sessions of the County Council, except meetings of 1 committees, shall be held at the County seat. The proceedings of 2 all Council meetings shall be taken by tape recorder. The tapes 3 of such meetings shall be retained in the Office of the Clerk of 4 the Council for a period of five years, at which time the tapes 5 shall be transferred to the Division of Records and Elections 6 which will retain such tapes for an additional five years. 7 8 SECTION 4. 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SECTION 6. INITIAL PROCESSING - ORDINANCES AND MOTIONS
Ordinance 1373, Section 8, Ordinance 1802, Section 2 and

K.C.C. 1.24.080 are amended as follows:

Ordinances and Motions shall be drafted in conformance with drafting guidelines prepared by the office of the Clerk of the Council.

((Proposed-ordinances-or-motions-must-be-filed-with-the Glerk-of-the-Gouncil-and-introduced-by-a-Council-Member.))

All official communications or requests for Council action from the Executive or Judicial Branches addressed to the Chairman shall be referred to the appropriate committee.

SECTION 7. INTRODUCTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCES.

Ordinance 1373, Section 9 and K.C.C. 1.24.090 are amended to read as follows:

The first reading of a proposed ordinance shall be by title only, unless three members demand reading in full.

After the first reading, proposed ordinances shall be referred to committee. Upon being reported back by the committee, all proposed ordinances shall be placed upon the calendar for public hearing and second reading.

SECTION 8. EXECUTIVE VETO.

Ordinance 1373, Section 14 and K.C.C. 1.24.140 are amended to read as follows:

Except as otherwise provided in the charter, a copy of the veto message of the Executive accompanying any proposed ordinance passed by the Council, together with the proposed ordinance vetoed, or the partial veto of an appropriations ordinance, shall be distributed to each Council member. ((Such-veto-shall-be placed-on-the-agenda-of-the-next-regular-Council-meeting.--It shall-then-be-in-order-to-proceed-to-the-reconsideration-of-the proposed-ordinance, refer-it, -lay-it-on-the-table, -or-postpone its-consideration-to-a-day-certain. In-the-case-of-an-appropriation-ordinance-containing-several-sections-or-items, -one-or-

more-of-which-have-been-objected-to-by-the-Executive; each-section or-item-so-objected-to-shall-be-voted-upon-separately-by-the

Gouncil:--Action-by-the-Gouncil-upon-all-vetoed-ordinances-shall-be-endorsed-upon-the-proposed-ordinance-and-certified-by-the

Chairman:)) Within thirty days after an ordinance has been vetoed or partially vetoed, the council may override such veto by enacting the ordinance by a minimum of six affirmative votes.

((Six-affirmative-votes-shall-be-required-to-over-ride-an Executive-veto:))

SECTION 9. LAPSE AND REINTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES

Ordinance 1373, Section 15 and K.C.C. 1.24.150 are amended
to read as follows:

Proposed ordinances and motions which have been introduced but not acted upon before the Council reconstitutes itself on the second Monday of January shall be deemed to have lapsed ((except-that-any-such-ordinance-or-metion-may-be-reintroduced-by-any-Gouncil-member; -within-the-following-30-days)) if not reintroduced or acted upon by the Council within thirty days from such date. Such ordinance or motion shall bear the same number assigned to it as when originally introduced.

SECTION 10. STANDING COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Ordinance 1373, Section 18 and K.C.C. 1.24.180 are amended to read as follows;

The date and time of standing committee meetings shall be determined by the Chairman of such committee. At least one day prior to the meeting, an agenda shall be posted outside the Council Chambers and shall include the time and place of ((all)) the committee meeting((s)).

Any member of the Council present at a meeting of any standing committee, though not a member thereof, shall be entitled to participate in the deliberations of such committee,

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1	but shall not be entitled to vote therein unless designated a
2	protem member by the committee chairman.
