- (7) "Grooming Parlor" means any place or establishment, public or private, where animals are bathed, clipped or combed for a consideration, for the purpose of enhancing their aesthetic value.
- (8) "Hobby Kennel" means a non-commercial kennel at, or adjoining a private residence where four or more adult animals are bred and/or kept for hunting, training, and exhibition for organized shows, field, working and/or obedience trials or for enjoyment of the species.
- (9) "Kennel" means a place where four or more adult dogs or cats or any combination thereof are kept, whether by owners of the dogs and cats or by persons providing facilities and care whether or not for compensation, but not including a small animal hospital or clinic or pet shop. An adult dog or cat is one of either sex, altered or unaltered, that has reached the age of four months.
- (10) "Livestock" means horses, bovine animals, sheep, goats swine, reindeer, donkeys and mules.
- (11) "Owner" means any person having an interest in or right of possession to an animal or any person having control, custody, or possession of an animal, or by reason of the animal being seen residing consistently at a location, shall be presumed to be the owner.
- (12) "Packs of Dogs' shall consist of a group of three or more dogs running upon either public or private property not that of its owner in a state in which either its control or ownership is in doubt or cannot readily be ascertained, and when such dogs are not restrained or controlled.
- (13) "Person" means any individual, partnership, firm, joint stock company, corporation, association, trust, estate or

1 other legal entity.

- (14) "Pet Shop means a person or establishment that, acquires animals bred by others (and/or-supplies) whether as owner, agent, or on consignment, sells, offers to sell such animals (and/or-supplies) to the public: PROVIDED, THAT said person or establishment derives more than twenty (20) percent of gross income from sales of such animals.
- (15) "Running at Large" means to be off the premises of the owner and not under the control of the owner or competent person authorized by the owner, either by leash or other means.
- (16) "Shelter" means a facility which is used to house or contain stray, homeless, abardoned or unwanted animals and which is owned, operated or maintained by a public body, and established humane society, animal welfare society, society for the prevention of cruelty to animals, or other nonprofit organization devoted to the welfare, protection, and humane treatment of animals.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE relating to Public Dance Halls and Public Dances, establishing rules, regulations, fees, prescribing penalties and repealing Resolutions 5170, 6912 and K.C.C. 6.20.010 through 6.20.040.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Definitions. For the purpose of this ordinance and unless the context plainly requires otherwise the following definitions are adopted:

- (a) PUBLIC DANCE shall be held and construed to mean any dance which is open to the public and which is held and conducted for a profit, direct or indirect.
- (b) PUBLIC DANCE HALL shall be held and construed to mean any place where a public dance is conducted, operated or maintained and shall include the premises on which said public dance is conducted, operated or maintained and any and all areas attached to or adjacent to such premises.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct, operate or maintain a public dance or public dance hall unless the person who is conducting, operating or maintaining such public dance or public dance hall has obtained a license or permit in the manner prescribed herein.

SECTION 3. Public Dance Hall application.

- (a) The person desiring to conduct, operate or maintain a public dance hall on a yearly or six month basis shall be responsible for obtaining a Public Dance Hall License from the director.
- (b) Renewal applications for a Public Dance Hall License (yearly or six month) shall be made in writing on forms provided by the director at least fourteen days prior to the expiration date of the existing license.

- (c) Each applicant for a license shall complete an application form prepared by the director which shall include the following information:
 - (1) The name and address of the applicant;
 - (2) If a corporation, the names and addresses of the offices or directors thereof;
 - (3) The name of business under which the activity is to be conducted;
 - (4) A declaration of any arrests, convictions, or confinements and;
 - (5) Any other information the director may require to aid in the implementation and enforcement of this ordinance. SECTION 4. Public Dance permit application.
- (a) The person desiring to conduct, operate or maintain a one-night public dance, whether on premises licensed as a Public Dance Hall or not, is responsible for obtaining a One-Night Public Dance permit from the director, at least fourteen days prior to the date said dance is to be held for each such one night public dance.
- (b) Each applicant shall be issued a permit upon completion of an application form which includes:
 - (1) Name of organization holding dance;
 - (2) Location of dance;
 - (3) Approval of King County Fire Marshal.

SECTION 5. Background Investigation. Upon the filing of an application for a Public Dance Hall License, the director shall refer the same to the King County Department of Public Safety for investigation of the statements contained in such application.

A written report containing the results of the Department of Public Safety investigation shall be furnished to the director if requested.

SECTION 6. - License or Permit requirements. Applicants must comply with the Building, Zoning, Planning and Fire Codes of

King County and with any rules or regulations set forth by the State of Washington Liquor Control Board. A written report that the applicant has complied with these Codes and regulations shall be furnished to the director before a license or permit under this ordinance is issued.

SECTION 7. Hours of Operation. No public dance or public dance hall shall be conducted, operated or maintained after the hours of 2:30 A.M.

SECTION 8. Fees. The fees for conducting, operating or maintaining a Public Dance Hall or Public Dance are hereby fixed as follows:

Public Dance Hall License (one year) - \$100.00 Public Dance Hall License (six month) - \$50.00 One-Night Public Dance Permit - \$15.00.

SECTION 9. Denial of license or permit.

- (a) The Director may deny a license or permit if the applicant or any of the applicant's officers, directors or partners have:
 - (1) Committed any act, which, if committed by a licensee, would be grounds for the suspension or revocation of a license or permit;
 - (2) Committed any act resulting in a conviction of a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude which is reasonably related to the license or permit applied for;
 - (3) Been refused a license or permit or had a license or permit revoked under the provisions of this ordinance; provided, however, that any applicant denied a license or permit may reapply after six months if the basis for such denial no longer exists;
 - (4) Committed any act for which a license is required under the provisions of this ordinance;

- (5) Failed to comply with the Building, Zoning, Planning or Fire Codes of King County, and any rules or regulations set forth by the State of Washington Liquor Control Board; or
- (6) Knowingly made any false statement in his application.
- (b) The Director may deny a license if he determines that the conduct, operation or maintenance of a Public Dance Hall or Public Dance will disturb the peace and quiet of the neighborhood in which the same is located.

SECTION 10. Suspension or revocation of license or permit.

- (a) The Director may suspend or revoke a license or permit if he determines that the licensee or permitee or any of the licensee's or permitee's officers, directors or partners have:
 - (1) Knowingly made any false statement or given any false information in connection with an application for a license or permit or a renewal of a license or permit;
 - (2) Failed to remove or attempt to remove from the dance premises any person whose conduct poses a physical danger to the safety of others present;
 - (3) Committed any act which is a ground for denial of a license, a permit; or
- (4) Violated any of the provisions of this ordinance.

 SECTION 11. Transferability of license or permit. Any
 license or permit issued under the provisions of this ordinance
 shall apply to a single location only and shall not be transferable to other locations; provided, however, that the license or
 permit may be transferred to another person provided such person
 satisfies the license permit requirements contained herein and
 pays a transfer fee of Twenty-five Dollars.
