AN ORDINANCE adopting a Uniform Fire Code for King County; prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from fire and explosion; providing for permits; prescribing penalties for violations; and repealing Ordinance 1284 and K.C.C. 17.04, 17.08, 17.12, 17.16, 17.20, 17.24, 17.28.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE, 1973 EDITION, as published by the Western Fire Chiefs Association and the International Conference of Building Officials (including Appendices A, C, D, and E) together with amendments, additions and deletions listed herein; are hereby adopted as the Fire Code of King County, and hereinafter referred to as "this code".

SECTION 2. Whenever the following words appear in this code, they are to be changed as follows:

- (1) Fire Chief, Chief of the Fire Department, Fire Prevention Engineer, to Fire Marshal of King County.
- (2) Fire Department to <u>Bureau of Fire Prevention of King</u> County.

SECTION 3. UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGE 14, SECTION 1.203, FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU, is hereby repealed and the following is ESTABLISHMENT AND DUTIES OF BUREAU substituted: SECTION 1.203. OF FIRE PREVENTION. For the purpose of this code the Bureau of Fire Prevention in the Building Division of King County shall be operated under the supervision of the Director of Building, Building Division, Department of Community and Environmental Development, and shall enforce the fire prevention provisions and shall have authority in a fire department or fire district in the performance of duties connected with this code. The Bureau of Fire Prevention may assume an advisory status in the matters of operation, function expenditure, tactics personnel and equipment or any other function as the fire district sees fit to request. The fire suppression and tactical provisions may be enforced by the Chief of a fire department or fire district. The Chief of a fire department or fire

district, acting under the supervision of the Board of Fire

Commissioners in that district, and in coordination with the

Bureau of Fire Prevention, may perform the duties specified in

the Uniform Fire Code within the geographical boundaries of that

fire protection district, to the full extent required by the

Bureau of Fire Prevention.

SECTION 4. UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGE 15, SECTION 1.205,
AUTHORITY AND DUTY OF POLICE PERSONNEL TO ASSIST IN ENFORCING THIS
CODE, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGE 18, SECTION 1.215, BOARD OF APPEALS, is hereby amended to read as follows: "In order to determine the suitability of alternate materials ((and-type)) or methods of construction, and to provide for reasonable interpretation of the provisions of this code, there shall be and is hereby created a ((Beard-of-Appeals)) Fire Prevention Advisory and Appeals Board, consisting of ((five)) seven members who are qualified by experience and training in fire protection to pass upon pertinent matters. The ((Fire-Ghief)) Fire Marshal shall be an ex officio member and shall act as Secretary of the Board. The ((Board-of-Appeals)) Fire Prevention Advisory and Appeals Board shall be appointed by the ((Executive-Body)) County Executive, confirmed by the Council, and shall ((held-effice at-their-pleasure.)) serve for a two-year term or until their successor is appointed and qualified. Initially four members shall be appointed to a two-year term and three members to a one-year term. The Board shall adopt reasonable rules and regulations for conducting its investigations and shall render all decisions and findings in writing to the ((Fire-Ghief)) Fire Marshal with a duplicate copy to the appellant and may recommend to the (Executive-Body)) County Council such new legislation as is consistent therewith."

SECTION 6. NEW SECTION. A new section is hereby added to the UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGE 36, ARTICLE 1, DIVISION IV, DEFINITIONS to read as follows:

SECTION 1.429. DEFINITION OF CURRENT EDITION. (1) Current edition of the Uniform Building Code shall be the 1973 Edition; (2) Current edition of the Uniform Mechanical Code shall be the 1973 Edition; and (3) Current edition of the National Fire Protec-8 tion Association shall be the 1971-1972 Edition.

SECTION 7. NEW SECTION. A new division, Division V, is hereby added to the UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGE 36, ARTICLE 1, GENERAL PROVISIONS, as follows:

DIVISION V. Section 1.501, VIOLATION PROVISIONS. Notwithstanding any specific remedies enumerated in the text of codes $14\,\|$ adopted by reference in this document or other regulations herein adopted; violation, or failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, shall subject the offender, upon conviction thereof, to a fine of not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00), in imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or 19 both, and each day that such violation or failure to comply exists $20\,\|$ shall constitute a separate offense. The prosecutor may, as an 21 alternative to criminal action, seek legal or equitable relief to enjoin or abate any violation of the laws incorporated by reference 23 herein.

Section 1.502. CIVIL PENALTY APPEAL. In addition to or as 25 an alternate to any judicial or administrative remedy provided here- $26\,\mathrm{||in}$ or by law, any person, firm, corporation or organization violating any of the provisions of this Code, or by each act of commission or omission procures, aids or abets such violation, shall in- $^{29}\parallel$ cur a cumulative civil penalty in the amount of three dollars per 30 day, per each violation, plus billable costs of the Building 31 Division, Department of Community and Environmental Development,

I from the date set for compliance until such violation is corrected 2 or such notice of violation order is complied with. All civil 3 penalties and appeals will be enforced in accordance with the procedures specified in the Uniform Housing Code, 1973 Edition, as amended and adopted by this ordinance.

SECTION 8. UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGES 71 AND 72, ARTICLE 12, 7 FIREWORKS, is hereby repealed. (For control of fireworks see Ordinance 480.)

SECTION 9. UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGE 75, SECTION 13.208, 10 | REQUIRED VERTICAL DRIVEWAY CLEARANCE, is hereby amended to read as follows: "Access driveways serving buildings or property located $12\,\|$ more than one hundred fifty (150) feet from a street shall have a vertical clearance of not less than twelve (12) feet above the finished driveway surface.

> EXCEPTION: Groups I and J Occupancies as specified in the Building Code.

Where auxiliary means of access or fire protective measures, 18 | approved by the ((Ghief)) Fire Marshal, are provided, the above required clearance may be modified or waived.

Fire lanes shall be established at buildings as required by the Fire Marshal. Such fire lanes shall be maintained with adequate height and width to allow access, and have a surface capable of supporting fire apparatus. Fire lanes shall be appropriately marked and obstruction of fire lanes is prohibited by other than emergency vehicles."

SECTION 10. UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGE 77, SECTION 13.307, FIRE ALARM SYSTEMS, is hereby amended by adding a new subsection as followe: (e) FIRE DRILLS. Fire drills shall be held at least once a month in educational occupancies where such occupancies constitute the major occupancy of a building and at least once every two months in institutional occupancies where such occupancies constitute the major occupancy of a building. During severe weather,

fire drills may be postponed. A record of all fire drills shall be kept by the person in charge of such occupancies. Records of fire drills shall include the time and date of each drill held.

In educational occupancies fire drills shall include complete evacuation of all persons from the building. In institutional occupancies fire drills shall be conducted to familiarize operating personnel with their assigned positions of emergency duty; complete evacuation of occupants from the building at the time of the fire drill shall be required only where it is practicable and does not involve moving or disturbing persons under medical care."

SECTION 11. UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGE 129, SECTION 15.704,
DISPENSING SERVICES, SUB-SECTION (b) SUPERVISION, is hereby amended
to read as follows: "Every service station open to the public shall
have an attendant or supervisor on duty whenever the station is open
for business.

1. If the dispensing of Class 1 liquids at a service station available and open to the public is to be done by a person other than the service station attendant, the nozzle shall be a listed automatic closing type without latch open device."

SECTION 12. UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGES 135 AND 136, SECTION 15.710, MARINE SERVICE STATIONS, SUB-SECTION (d) DISPENSING 3., is hereby amended to read as follows: "Dispensing of flammable or combustible liquids into the fuel tanks of marine craft shall be by means of an approved type hose, equipped with a listed automatic closing nozzle ((with)) without a latch open device."

SECTION 13. NEW SECTION. A new section is hereby added to the UNIFORM FIRE CODE, PAGE 210, ARTICLE 31, WELDING AND CUTTING, CALCIUM CARBIDE AND ACETYLENE, to read as follows:

SECTION 31.114. PERMIT REQUIRED. A "no fee" permit shall be required of each company, corporation, co-partnership or owner-operator performing welding or cutting operations. This permit shall not be required for each welding or cutting job location.

The company, corporation, co-partnership or owner-operator shall notify the Bureau of Fire Prevention in advance where such work is taking place, except where such work is done in response to an emergency call that does not allow time for the Bureau of Fire Prevention to be notified in advance of the work.

SECTION 14. REPEAL. King County Code Chapters 17.04, 17.08, 17.12, 17.16, 17.20, 17.24, 17.28 and Ordinance 1284 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 15. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of constitutionality of the remaining portions of this ordinance, it being herein expressly declared that this ordinance and each section, subsection paragraph, sentence, clause and phrase thereof would have been adopted irrespective of the fact that any one or more other sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.
