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2105 ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE amending King County Ordinance 1438, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.16.090 and 2.16.130, establishing that all employees of the Department of Rehabilitative Services except its chief officers shall be members of the Career Service System.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 1438, as amended by Ordinance 1872, and K.C.C. 2.16.130, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Department of Rehabilitative Services -- Duties --The department of rehabilitative services shall be Divisions. responsible for the administration of the division of involuntary treatment, detention, client services, and judicial services and shall include a research and evaluation function.

- INVOLUTARY TREATMENT DIVISION. The involuntary treatment division shall be responsible for the administration of programs relating to the involuntary treatment and commitment of the mentally ill.
- DETENTION DIVISION. The detention division shall be responsible for the administration of criminal detention facilities and work release programs.
- (c) CLIENT SERVICES DIVISION. The client services division shall be responsible for service contract development and negotiation, pre-sentence diagnosis and reporting, and rehabilitation services.

- (d) JUDICIAL SERVICES DIVISION. The judicial services division shall be responsible for pre-trial release information collection and post-sentence monitoring.
- Services, except the chief officer of the Department and its

  Divisions, and their administrative assistants and confidential secretaries appointed pursuant to Article 5, Section 550 of the King County Charter, shall be members of the Career Service System; PROVIDED, this provision shall not include commissioned members of the Department of Public Safety or Seattle Police Department, temporarily assigned to the Department of Rehabilitative services.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 1438, Section 4, and K.C.C. 2.16. 090, is hereby amended to read as follows:

The County Executive shall appoint the chief officer of each executive department subject to confirmation by a majority of the County Council. These chief officers shall include the heads of the following executive departments: Public Works and Transportation, Community and Environmental Development, Public Safety, Budget and Program Planning, Rehabilitative Services, and Executive Administration. The chief officer of each executive department shall appoint the chief officer of each division subject to the approval by the County Executive and subject to confirmation by a majority of the County Council, except that appointments by the County Administrative Officer and Director
