ordinance no. 2193

AN ORDINANCE regulating the moving of buildings along or across any public right of way or public property and adding new sections to the King County Traffic Code, K.C.C. Title 46.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.010 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code, which reads as follows:

The Department of Executive Administration, Real Property Division is hereby authorized to issue permits for the moving of a building along or across any public right of way or public property. No permit to move a building over twenty feet wide or requiring the use of dollies shall be issued except to authorized house movers.

SECTION 2: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.020 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

Before a permit will be issued, the building mover must submit an application to the permit clerk, Real Property Divison. Such application shall state the following:

- (a) Present location of building to be moved
- (b) Proposed new location of building
- (c) Building permit number
- (d) Dimensions of building when loaded, including eaves and porches, if any
 - (e) Proposed route over which it is to move
 - (f) Name of subcontractor, if any
 - (g) Certificate of insurance to comply with Section 12
- (h) Such other information which may aid the Division in determining whether or not to approve such application.

SECTION 3: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.030 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

1 The cost of a permit fee for each move shall be: 2 For moves during the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 3 3:00 p.m. (1)maximum of sixteen feet wide \$ 8.00 5 (2) over sixteen to twenty-nine feet wide 15.00 6 over thirty feet wide 25.00 7 (b) Moves other than regular hours **75.**00 8 plus \$11.00 for 9 each additional hour after four 10 hours 11 Movement of buildings over fourteen feet wide is prohibited on 12 Fridays after 1:00 p.m., on holidays observed by King County, 13 and during the afternoon of the day preceding said holiday. 14 any of the holidays fall on a Saturday or Sunday, the preceding 15 Friday or following Monday shall be considered a holiday. 16 All moves and time of moves must be approved by Manager 17 of the Real Property Division or his designee. 18 A permit will be issued upon satisfactory completion 19 of the application for buildings where the load is over twenty 20 feet wide. Application must be received 72 hours prior to move. 21 NEW SECTION. SECTION 4: A new section, K.C.C. 22 46.45.040 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which 23 reads as follows: 24 It shall be the responsibility of the building mover 25 to: 26 (a) Inspect the proposed route of each move before 27 the application is made 28 Contact utility companies regarding the moving of 29 wires, poles, and/or other obstacles of a similar nature when 30 required 31 Notify the Department of Public Works, Traffic 32

- (d) Notify all fire districts into or through which the move will be made
- Obtain permission from the local authorities (e) when the move is to pass through an incorporated area or on a state highway.

In the case of a subcontractor, the permit user shall meet the same requirements as the permittee.

SECTION 5: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.050 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

The following restrictions shall be observed by building movers:

- All loads exceeding eight feet, six inches in width, up to and including 10 feet in width will require one riding flagman on two and three lane highways.
- Pilot cars front and rear will be required on all loads over ten feet wide, on two and three lane highways.
- (c) One pilot car in rear will be required on all four lane highways when the load is over twelve feet wide up to twenty feet wide. Over twenty feet wide, pilot cars front and rear will be required.
- At least one uniformed escort will be required (d) on moving all buildings over twenty feet wide. When designated by the manager of the Real Property Division or his designee a uniformed, off-duty law-enforcement officer may be required.

SECTION 6: NEW SECTION. A new section K.C.C. 46.45.060 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

The permit holder or subcontractor shall furnish all pilot cars.

Front pilot cars shall be passenger cars or light trucks with a minimum weight of three thousand pounds, and a maximum capacity not to exceed eight thousand pounds. Rear pilot cars may exceed the above tonnage.

Cars shall be of such design so as to afford the driver clear and unobstructed vision both front and rear, be in safe operational condition and properly licensed. Pilot car operators shall be experienced in the operation of escort cars and no unnecessary passengers who could distract operators in escort vehicles shall be permitted.

When required, pilot cars will travel at a distance of approximately three hundred fifty feet to eight hundred feet in front of and to the rear of the load, or at such reasonable distance as to insure the maximum security to the traveling public.

When dictated by hazardous conditions, the pilot car driver will act as flagman for traffic control and will signal by hand or by radio to the towing vehicle driver when he can proceed without conflict with approaching traffic. The driver of the rear escort car will act as flagman when hazardous conditions exist and in turning movements will advise the towing vehicle driver as to clearance and of accumulations of overtaking traffic so the driver can provide an opportunity to pass.

Pilot car operators shall be properly licensed to operate the vehicle. When uniformed off-duty law enforcement officers act as escorts using official police cars or motorcycles, the preceding escort car requirements shall not be applicable.

Two (2) seven (7) inch minimum flashing amber lights or a single rotating flashing beacon will be displayed on the top, above the roof line of car escorts (pilot) cars and plainly visible. The amber lights used for this purpose shall meet SAE Standard Specifications (SAE J59 5b) "Flashing Warning Lamps for Authorized Emergency, Maintenance and Service Vehicles." These amber lights will operate at all times during movement of

oversize unit.

SECTION 7: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.070 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

The flagman, who may be the foreman, shall be at least Eighteen (18) years of age and shall be equipped with a red flag not less than twelve (12) inches square or some other proper traffic directional device. The flagman may ride in the cab of the tow vehicle with the driver, or may accompany the movement in another vehicle not being operated by permit authority. At least one flagman must accompany each move for which a flagman is stipulated in the permit.

The flagman shall dismount and direct traffic at all locations where traffic may be obstructed, or when it is necessary to infringe on the opposite bound traffic lane due to breakdown, pulling on or off the road, or other causes and through the use of the red flag, shall warn traffic of the approaching load at danger points such as bridges, tunnels and sharp corners where the vehicle or vehicles plan to turn.

SECTION 8: <u>NEW SECTION.</u> A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.080 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

"Oversize Load" signs at least six feet long and twelve inches high, with black ten inch letters drawn with two inch stroke on yellow background will be mounted above the cab of the towing vehicle and/or on the rear of the trailing unit and will be mounted on top, above the roof line, of escort cars, a minimum of five feet from the roadway surface, measured from the bottom of the sign.

Such signs will be displayed only when the unit is in transit and must be removed or retracted at all other times.

SECTION 9: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.090 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

Only equipment that has been authorized for moving operations within King County shall be used. All equipment must comply with the equipment requirements of the Washington State Motor Vehicle Laws.

Any equipment which breaks down and causes undue delay or any equipment breakdown which occurs frequently is just cause for the manager of the Real Property Division or his designee to rule against further use of such equipment. Such condemned equipment shall not be used until repaired by mover and repairs approved by the manager of the Real Property Division or his designee.

All dollies shall be licensed and covered by liability insurance. Spare tires or wheels for all dollies will be carried on each move.

SECTION 10: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.100 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

All trucks shall be licensed and covered by liability insurance. Spare tires for all trucks shall be carried on each move.

The towing truck shall have adequate power to start and pull the building being moved on upgrades of five (5) per cent. For grades greater than five (5) per cent, additional power may be used in the form of a tow at the front of the operation. On down grades greater than five (5) per cent extra breaking power may be provided in the form of a hold back truck in the rear.

A second towing truck will be available on each move on an arterial street or bus route, capable of continuing the move should the first unit have a breakdown. Should the need arise for outside help to continue the move, the escort officer shall call any outside source available and the cost of such extra help shall be paid by the mover.

SECTION 11: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.110 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

- (a) Tire and axle loading shall comply with Washington State Motor Vehicle load limits.
- (b) A fifth wheel type suspension with two non-steering dollies will be acceptable for buildings which do not exceed forty-six feet overall in length. Longer buildings will be moved on steering dollies because of the need for maneuverability.

SECTION 12: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.120 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

The house mover shall provide evidence of comprehensive public liability and property damage liability insurance, including comprehensive automobile liability and property damage insurance with limits of liability of not less than:

- (a) \$100,000 each person bodily injury liability \$300,000 each occurrence bodily injury liability
- (b) \$100,000 each occurrence property damage liability \$100,000 aggregate property damage liability or a combined single limit policy of not less than
 - \$300,000 each occurrence bodily injury and property
 damage liability
 \$300,000 aggregate
- (d) The County of King shall be named as an additional insured as its interest may appear.

SECTION 13: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.130 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

Wide loads moved during hours of daylight shall display the prescribed one hundred forty-four square inch red colored flag on each corner.

Wide loads moving during hours of darkness shall have

the following electrically operated lighting system:

- (a) Not less than seven approved type blinking electric lights, these lights to have a 360° red or amber lens and not less than a ten candlepower bulb. Arrangement and spacing of such lights will comply with Washington State Motor Vehicle Regulations.
- (b) The spacing of these blinking type lights to be as follows: One on each of the four corners of the building; also one light on each side of the building in the middle and also one light in center of back of the building.
- (c) A light every five feet across the rear and also one every eight (8) feet on the sides. These lights may be nonflashing type but must be electric and not less than six candlepower. Additional lights may be required by the manager of the Real Property Division or his designee.
- (d) The towing truck shall have two yellow blinking lights visible from the front. These lights shall be four inches in diameter and shall have not less than a fifteen candlepower bulb. Directional lights are acceptable.

SECTION 14: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.140 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

The Manager of the Real Property Division may promulgate any rules and regulations necessary for the operation of this chapter.

SECTION 15: NEW SECTION. A new section, K.C.C. 46.45.150 is hereby added to the King County Traffic Code which reads as follows:

The following safety requirements shall be observed by all building movers:

- (a) Building movers shall be familiar with and shall comply with the Washington Industrial Safety and Health Act.
- (b) At the time personnel are on the roof of a building handling overhead wiring they shall wear rubber gloves
