ordinance no. 2230

AN ORDINANCE adopting the 1975 Annual Budget; and making appropriations for the operation of County agencies and departments and capital improvements for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 1975, and ending December 31, 1975.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1: That the 1975 Annual budget is hereby adopted and subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth and the several amounts hereinafter specified or so much thereof as shall be sufficient to accomplish the purposes designed, appropriations are hereby authorized to be distributed for salaries, wages and other expenses of the various agencies and departments of King County for capital improvements, and for other specified purposes for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 1975, and ending December 31, 1975, out of the several funds of the County hereinafter named and set forth in the following sections.

SECTION 2: The Annual Budget provides funding for cost-of-living adjustments. In the event cost-of-living adjustments are greater than funding provided, all budgets shall be internally adjusted within the amounts appropriated less any unappropriated funds.

SECTION 3: Within the Current Expense Fund and the Road Fund are funds along with ending cash balances as of December 31, 1974, to cover merit pay and labor negotiation settlements. The County Executive is authorized to distribute the required portion of these funds among the affected positions in each operating fund effective January 1, 1975.

 - b. Six additional man-months of development effort for the Districts Courts for continuation of the automation required for complaint processing and for a study using the Mag Card as a computer terminal; This effort will be coordinated with the District Court Administrator;
 - c. Twelve additional man-months of development effort for Comptroller for continued enhancement of the financial systems providing additional cost savings within the Comptroller's Department, for implementation of the BARS Reporting system, and for contingencies;

- d. - The documentation for system proposals shall contain a separate section titled, "Audit Section", which shall define the controls, the visibility of the step-by-step process from input to the final output, and for balancing the totals throughout the system; This section shall be developed in conjunction with each department; This section shall be mandatory for all financial systems and may not be mandatory for non-financial systems depending on the nature of the computer applications; In either event, the Auditor shall be provided a copy of all developmental proposals for adherence to this objective;

- 10) The work program supporting the 1975 budget of the Parks Division shall:
 - a. Emphasize use of capital resources to develop facilities for soccer, baseball, tennis and other active sports in neighborhoods where citizens have requested them;
 - b. Provide a means to encourage service clubs and organized sports groups to assist in overall park maintenance; ways should be investigated by which land can be developed by special activity groups for shared use between them and the general public;
 - c. Provide for analysis of design costs of park construction and consider repeated use of successful designs rather than unique designs for each County project;

- d. Address the cost of maintaining and policing County parks and trails; The relationship between maintenance and developed park acreage should be considered; park construction should minimize potential vandalism and maintenance costs;
- e. Consider implementation of a policy of minimum cleanup of property immediately after acquisition (wherever possible, using the Neighborhood Youth Corps under supervision); and provision of a means whereby all vacant park land purchased could be improved to the point of making it safe and usable by the public; This should include removal of abandoned structures and debris and provision of signs indicating the land is park property;
- f. Provide for investigation of the use of capital funds for upgrading school recreation facilities to enable greater utilization of these facilities during the summer months;
- g. Provide for development of a park plan for all open spaces donated to the County; the plan shall show minimum improvements, the condition in which open space for public use is to be accepted and how the County intends to control and maintain sites;
- 11) Tennis Courts (Project #007291) scheduled for construction in 1975 shall be constructed in areas East of Interstate 5.

Within this appropriation the Building Division Manager shall develop a procedure for processing applications for permits that minimizes the time required, maximizes the feedback to the applicant relative to status, and to the maximum degree possible, provides the applicant with a "one-stop" process and consider an expeditor to assure timely processing; If necessary, such a process may require additional copies of data from the applicant, to allow simultaneous processing by separate involved agencies; Such developed procedure shall be reported for review by the Council's Committee on Community and Environmental Development on or before January 31, 1975.

SECTION 71: Budget and Program Planning - The Council intends that:

- 1) The Department of Budget and Program Planning submit quarterly status reports beginning April 1, 1975 on 1975's work program to the appropriate Council committees.
- 2) The proposal of the Wallingford Community Council for the Home of the Good Shepherd property be evaluated and recommendations for County participation be presented to the Community and Environmental Development and Intergovernmental Committees on or before January 31, 1975.

SECTION 72: Building - The Council intends that:

- 1) The Division Manager, prior to January 31, 1975, review with the Budget and Long Range Planning Committee the adequacy of the current permit fee schedule and the degree to which permit revenues estimated in 1975 will finance Building Division functions directly related to permit issuance and building inspection.
- 2) The Division Manager, prior to January 31, 1975, review with the Community and Environmental Development Committee the status of the addressing program.

SECTION 73: Youth Affairs - The Council intends that:

1) The Youth Affairs Administration submit a quarterly report beginning April 1, 1975, to the Community and Environmental Development Committee on the status of each Youth Affairs program based on a centralized reporting and accountability management monitoring system;

- 2) The Division of Youth Affairs present to the Council Community and Environmental Development Committee a plan by July 1, 1975, showing the feasibility of consolidating Jobline, Neighborhood Youth Corps, and Juvenile Court services with the Youth Service Bureaus;
 - 3) A proposal be presented to the Council Community and Environmental Development Committee by May 1, 1975, on continuance of the Youth Service programs which Youth Service Bureaus provide;
 - 4) The Division of Youth Affairs coordinate utilization of some Neighborhood Youth Corps participants in King County's Roads Beautification and Maintenance Programs in the Departments of Public Works and Community Development.

SECTION 74: Medical Examiner - The Council intends

that:

1) The Medical Examiner shall use methods to reduce

- 1) The Medical Examiner shall use methods to reduce expenditures in transporting deceased persons. The Medical Examiner shall report to the Health and Safety Committee by April 30, 1975 on an evaluation of alternative methods of deceased transportation to include contracting for such services.
- 2) The Medical Examiner shall work with the Department of Public Safety, the Seattle Police Department and other law enforcement agencies to determine if police investigation reports could be used as the Medical Examiner investigation report. The Medical Examiner shall include the above in his report to the Health and Safety Committee.
- 3) The Medical Examiner shall develop with the assistance of Systems Services Division, an improved method of collecting required statistical data.

4) The Medical Examiner shall be authorized to receive revenue for services performed for other than statutory responsibilities.

All revenue generated by the office shall be consistent with administrative policies and procedures established by the County and reviewed by the Health and Safety Committee.

5) The Medical Examiner and Director of Public Health shall continue to explore the possibility of cooperation with the University of Washington and Harborview Medical Center, provided that any cooperative effort shall be economically beneficial to King County.

SECTION 75: Public Safety - The Council intends that:

1) The Department will negotiate and present to the Council for approval a mutual aid agreement with the City of Seattle on or before the end of April, 1975.

SECTION 76: Rehabilitative Services - The Council intends that:

- 1) The Department evaluate the possibility of establishing a new men's work release unit separate from the jail and furnish the Council Health & Safety Committee with recommendations addressing the benefits and negative impacts of such a program by April 1, 1975.
- 2) The Department develop and implement a detailed orientation process that ensures maximum inmate understanding of:
 legal rights, jail rules and regulations, legal resources
 available, the inmate grievance process, educational and
 vocational resources available, medical and psychiatric
 resources available and other critical factors involved with

incarceration. The orientation process should be formally structured and occur as soon as practical following the physical booking of the person. The proposed process should be discussed with the Health and Safety Committee by April 1, 1975.

- 3) The Director review in detail the County's experience in contracting detention services to the City of Seattle during the six-month period July 1 through December 31, 1974. That the review include detailed cost benefit analysis of expected and actual incremental savings factors, and that any recommendations for improvement/modification of the contractual arrangement with the City of Seattle be presented to the Health & Safety Committee prior to January 31, 1975.
- 4) The Council recognizes the importance of a work-release program for women as part of the rehabilitation program.

SECTION 77: Art Commission - The Council intends that:

1) the Arts Commission more actively seek funding from National Societies or other groups.

SECTION 78: Stadium Management - The Council intends that:

1) Management should consider contracting or pooling craftstype skills with other agencies like Facilities and Public Works.

SECTION 79: Juvenile Court - The Council intends that:

1) The Juvenile Court provide quarterly documentation to the Council Operations and Judiciary Committee beginning January 1, 1975 on the daily occupancy rate of the Youth Center with a breakdown of the classification of the youth (dependent-incorrigible, dependent-rebellious, and dependent-neglected) including average length of stay for each youth classification.

- 2) The Juvenile Court submit a schedule of the planned activities for the Social Development element by February 1, 1975 to the Council Operations and Judiciary Committee.
- 3) No Juvenile Court positions be filled after June 1, 1975, unless performance evaluation criteria for each position is developed and presented to the Council Operatins and Judiciary Committee.
- 4) The Juvenile Court perform and present to the Council Operations and Judiciary Committee by August 1, 1975 a feasibility study for alternative uses of the youth facility to address, at a minimum, the following:
 - a. Mental Health needs,
 - b. Senior citizen's needs,
 - c. Children with special needs,
 - d. Youth Service Bureaus.
- 5) By July 1, 1975 the Juvenile Court present to the Council Operations and Judiciary Committee documentation on the effectiveness of the Conference Committees.

SECTION 80: District Courts - The Council intends that:

- 1) The Court Administrator shall study the possibility of night courts at Seattle and Bellevue Courts and report to the Operations and Judiciary Committee by April 1, 1975.
- 2) The Court Administrator shall encourage systems modernization and increased use of data processing applications and report to the Operations and Judiciary Committee by April 1, 1975.
- 3) The Court Administrator shall work with the King County Magistrates' Association to study the possibility of "trading off" between judges to equalize workloads and report to the Operations and Judiciary Committee by April 1, 1975.
- 4) The Court Administrator shall determine legislative changes necessary for a centralized Traffic Violations

 Bureau to be administered within the King County Court

 House and report to the Operations and Judiciary Committee by April 1, 1975.

SECTION 81: Judicial Administration - The Council supports

1) A change in State Law to allow the Clerk's Trust Funds on deposit to be invested for interest usable to support general County operations.

 SECTION 82: Public Health Department - The Council intends that:

Administration

1) The County Executive shall report to the Council by March 31, 1975 on the feasibility of transferring the fiscal management of the Health Department to King County.

Jail Infirmary

2) The jail physician shall report to the City and County
Council by April 30, 1975 on recommended program of medical
care for jail inmates, including projected costs of alternative
medical programs.

Laboratory

3) The Department of Budget and Program Planning, in cooperation with Council staff and the Seattle City staff, shall conduct a study of laboratories in the Seattle area funded by public money, and report to the Health and Safety Committee by June 30, 1975 on possible laboratory consolidation and alternative methods of providing necessary services to King County.

Health Education

4) An evaluation of the health education shall be performed; included in the evaluation shall be proposed policies and standards for a local government-sponsored health education program.

Nursing Programs

- 5) Necessary home visits to the County's elderly and homebound shall be continued.
- 6) The Health Department, with cooperation of City and County staffs, shall evaluate all existing nursing programs, set standards and make recommendations to the Health and Safety Committee of the Council by June 30, 1975 on alternative methods of providing necessary services and the type of employees needed

to perform these services.

7) The Health Department and the King County Mental Health Board shall define what constitutes a mental health service and how the Department and King County Mental Health Board shall allocate administrative responsibility for adequately monitoring mental health nursing services.

- 8) The government-funded portion of nursing services shall provide adequate home nursing services for people unable to use health clinics and unable to pay.
- 9) The Health Department conduct a study to determine if fees can be charged to those persons who are able to pay and report the results to the Health and Safety Committee by March 31, 1975.

Reorganization

- 10) The proposed Health Department reorganization is preliminary in nature and does not adequately address the problems of providing health services to the citizens of King County.

 The Health Department shall report to the Health and Safety Committee of the Council on or before June 1, 1975 on how it intends to implement a reorganization that is acceptable to King County.
- 11) Reorganization shall emphasize direct services rather than administration.
- 12) The Director of Public Health is authorized to hire the Director of Operations, Director of Staff Services and Chief Environmental Specialist in accordance with the Health Department reorganization plan.

SECTION 83: Mental Health/Mental Retardation - The Council
intends that:

1) The Executive recommendation on adoption of the 1976 mental health and mental retardation plan shall be submitted for Council consideration no later than June 1, 1975.

SECTION 84: Alcoholism - The Council intends that:

- 1) The Alcoholism Treatment Center evaluate professional and technical training and financing opportunities in support of followup programs (i.e., GI Bill financing, indigent tuition waivers, minority financial, support program).
- 2) The Center evaluate and provide to the King County Council potential sources of program reimbursement, including but not limited to insurance and patient billings.
- 3) The Executive's recommendation on adoption of the 1976 Alcoholism plan shall be submitted to the Health and Safety Committee consideration no later than June 1, 1975.

SECTION 85: Architecture - The Council intends that:

- 1) The Division of Architecture, prior to January 31, 1975, provide detail to the Budget and Long Range Planning Committee that relates each project in the adopted 1975 Capital Budget, requiring Design Commission/Division of Architecture action to the Division's 1975 work plan. In addition, Division—managed projects not in the Capital Budget should be included in the work plan detail. All projects should be assigned realistic priorities and completion dates in the detail provided. The project detail provided should be in the project order applicable to the 1975 adopted Capital Budget.
- 2) The ten tennis courts detailed in the 19/5 adopted Capital Budget (Project #007291), should be constructed in locations to the East of Interstate Highway No. 5.
