

ORDINANCE NO. 2238

AN ORDINANCE establishing a joint Division of Alcoholism Services within the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health, defining the responsibilities of the Division, clarifying the status of County Divisions within the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health, adding new sections to Resolution 12356 and K.C.C. 2.24, as amended, amending Ordinance 1596 and K.C.C. 8.64.030, and amending Ordinance 2072.

Section 1. NEW SECTION. There is hereby added a new section to Resolution 12356 and K.C.C. 2.24, as amended, to read as follows:

There is hereby established a joint Division of Alcoholism Services within the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health.

The Division of Alcoholism Services shall be responsible for the administration and staffing of all Department programs relating to the prevention and treatment of alcoholism.

The Division of Alcoholism Services shall include a manager and such staff as are necessary to accomplish its duties, subject to authorization by Council. The management and administration of the Division of Alcoholism Services shall be vested in the director of the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health who shall appoint a manager for the Division pursuant to Ordinance 1438. The staffing responsibilities shall be the responsibility of the manager in accordance with career service rules.

The Division shall provide staffing services to the King County Alcohol Administrative Board, provided that the King County Alcohol Administrative Board shall select and employ one exempt senior staff position subject to the approval of the County Executive.

1            Section 2. NEW SECTION. There is hereby added  
2 a new section to Resolution 12356 and K.C.C. 2.24, as amended,  
3 to read as follows:

4            Employees of the Medical Examiner's Office, Emergency  
5 Medical Services Division, the Alcoholism Services Division,  
6 and the Human Services Division shall be County Employees.

7            Section 3. Ordinance 1596, Section 1, and K.C.C.  
8 8.64.010 are amended to read as follows:

9            Establishment. There is established a division  
10 of emergency medical services within the Seattle-King County  
11 Department of Public Health ((King County department of health  
12 and social services)).

13           Section 4. Ordinance 1596, Section 3, and K.C.C.  
14 8.64.030 are amended to read as follows:

15           Administration. The management and administration  
16 of the division of emergency medical services shall be vested  
17 in the director of the Seattle-King County Department of Public  
18 Health ((King County department of health and social services))  
19 who shall appoint a manager as provided by Section 2.16.100 of  
20 this code. The staffing responsibilities shall be the responsi-  
21 bility of the manager in accordance with career service rules.

22           Section 5. Ordinance 2072, Section 2, is amended  
23 to read as follows:


24           The Division of Human Services shall include a manager  
25 and such staff as are necessary to accomplish its duties. It

1 shall not include the Mental Health ((7)) and Mental Retardation  
2 ((and Alcehst)) Advisory and Administrative Boards or the Seattle-  
3 King County Drug Commission (hereafter referred to as the Boards)  
4 or their direct and exclusive staff.




