## ORDINANCE NO. 2494

AN ORDINANCE relating to a proposed amendment of Article 6, King County Charter, submitting same to the voters of the County and establishing date of election and establishing a Districting Committee.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There shall be submitted to the qualified voters of King County for their approval and ratification or rejection, at the next general election to be held in this county, an amendment to Article 6 of the King County Charter:

<u>DELETING</u> Section 650.30.20 through 650.30.50, and <u>ADDING</u> new Section 650.30.20 and 650.30.30 as appear below: 650.30.20 DISTRICTING COMMITTEE

During the month of January, 1981, and by January 31st of each fifth year thereafter, a five-member Districting Committee shall be appointed. The County Council shall appoint four persons to the committee, two from each of the two major political parties the four to appoint the fifth who shall be the Chairperson. The Districting Committee shall within 30 days of their appointment meet and appoint a Districting Master who shall be qualified by education, training and experience to draw a districting plan. If the Districting Committee is unable to agree upon the appointment of a Districting Master within 30 days, the County Council shall appoint a Districting Master by March 31st of that year.

## 650.30.30 DISTRICTING PLAN.

The Districting Master shall draw a Districting Plan for the county which shall be submitted by May 1st of the same year to the Districting Committee for adoption with or without amendment. The Districting Committee shall adopt the Districting Plat within 15 days. Upon adoption, the Districting Plat shall be submitted to the Clerk of the County Council by the Districting Committee. The plan shall become effective upon filing.
