1. - A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 112th Avenue S. E., hereinafter described.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 2. The report of the Department of Public Works and Transportation, Traffic and Planning Division, Real Property Division and Land Use Management, finds that the portion to be vacated is useless to the County and the vacation would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the comprehensive plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of the proposed vacation.
- 3. The vacation area was obtained by a plat filed in 1904. There is no record indicating county funds have been expended on this area either for acquisition or maintenance. It is believed that the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the tax rolls.
- 4. The description of the vacation area has been tailored to retain an additional 12 feet of right of way on 112th Avenue S.E. which is a Secondary Arterial and may ultimately require 84 feet of right of way width.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the Sid day of Quentus, 1975.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF KING:

SECTION 1. The Council on the <u>St</u> day of <u>Nacember</u>, 1975, hereby vacates and abandons a portion of 112th Avenue S.E., described as follows:

All that portion of 112th Avenue S.E. 60 feet in width, lying Easterly of and adjacent to the North 72 feet of Tract 196 of C. D. Hillman's Lake Washington Garden of Eden Addition to Seattle, Division No. 3 (Volume 11, page 81, records of King County, Washington). EXCEPT any

portion thereof lying Southeasterly of a line 42 feet Northwesterly of and parallel to the center-line of Lake Washington Boulevard.
