## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of llth Place South, and an alley between South 198th Street and South 199th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The report of the Department of Public Works and Transportation and Community and Environmental Development, Land Use Management Division, finds that the portion to be vacated is useless to the county and the vacation would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of the proposed vacation.
- 3. The vacation area was obtained by plat and there is no record indicating county funds have been expended on this area either for acquisition or maintenance. It is believed that the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the tax rolls.
- 4. The description of the vacation area has been revised to retain an additional 12 feet of right of way on Des Moines Way in accordance with the long range plans for the road. The petitioners have also conveyed additional right of way to King County for the future widening of Des Moines Way.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF KING:

SECTION 1. The Council on the 12th day of Opril, 1976, hereby vacates and abandons a portion of 11th Place South, and an alley between South 198th Street and South 199th Street, described as follows:

All that portion of 11th Place South lying between Blocks

8 and 9 of Knight's Second Addition to Des Moines (Vol. 5, Page 3) and lying Northwesterly of Des Moines Way; EXCEPT any portion thereof lying within 42 feet of the centerline of Des Moines Way. ALSO, all of the alley lying Westerly of said Block 9. INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this 23 nd February, 1976.
