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ORDINANCE NO. _____

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AN ORDINANCE relating to Rules and Order of Business of the King County Council, amending Ordinance 2347 and K.C.C.1.24.170.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 2347 and K.C.C. 1.24.170 are hereby amended as follows:

Standing committees. The chairman of the council shall appoint the chairman, vice chairman and the membership of the standing committees, with consent of a majority of the council members.

The standing committees are established as follows:

(1) Health and Human Services - Four or More Members.

Function: to consider and make recommendations on all matters relating to health, welfare, and human resource programs of the county including human service functional planning and programming.

(2) Planning and Community Development - Five Members.

Function: to consider and make recommendations on all matters pertaining to comprehensive planning within the county, including long range and community plans, functional plans for housing, parks and recreation, transportation, economic development, shoreline management, open space, air and water quality; to consider and report on all matters pertaining to zoning and other land use development controls.

(3) Finance, Audit and Budget - Four or More Members.

Function: to recommend budget objectives and priorities and schedule for the Council's review of the yearly Executive budget proposal; to consider and make recommendations on all matters and legislation of a financial nature, including appropriations, expenditures, the selling of bonds and investment policies; and on all matters relating to the levying of taxes; to investigate and report on all financial claims filed against

1 the county; to examine requests for changes in assessments and
2 taxes; to receive and examine reports of the County and State
3 Auditor and submit such recommendations to the County Council
4 as it deems necessary or desirable in connection with the sub-
5 ject matter of such reports; and corrdinate Council overview
6 of the economy, efficiency and effectiveness of all County
7 departments and programs.

8 (4) Inter-Governmental Relations - Four or More Members.

9 Function: to consider and make recommendations on all matters
10 of joint interest between the county and (a) other counties,
11 the state of Washington and the federal government, (b) the
12 city of Seattle and other towns and municipalities within the
13 county, and (c) other government agencies such as Metro, the
14 Puget Sound Council of Governments and Central Puget Sound
15 Economic Development District.

16 (5) Operations, Police and Judiciary - Four or More Members.

17 Function: to consider and make recommendations on matters
18 relating to county personnel and governmental organization; to
19 oversee and receive reports from the Office of Citizens'
20 Complaints; to consider and make recommendations on all matters
21 relating to County records and elections; to consider and make
22 recommendations on all matters relating to amendment of the
23 County Charter; to consider and make recommendations on all
24 matters relating to the criminal justice system, including law,
25 safety and justice, functional planning and programming.

26 (6) Public Facilities and Utilities - Four or More Members.

27 Function: to consider and make recommendations on all matters
28 relating to the construction and maintenance of the County road
29 and park system, and on all matters concerning public facilities,
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1 solid waste, surface water, fire protection and utilities, includ-
2 ing public facilities and utilities; to consider and make
3 recommendations on all matters concerning building permits,
4 building codes and other technical codes and regulations.


5 (7) Personnel -- Five Members, to be chaired by the Council
6 Chairman. The composition of the committee shall be reflective
7 of the Council. Function: to implement Council personnel policy
8 and make recommendations on matters relating to legislative
9 branch organization and personnel, including but not limited to,
10 screening processes, employment practices, performance evaluation,
11 reporting relationships, salary levels, incentive programs,
12 vacation and leave practices, levels of employment, new positions,
13 employees and employees' contracts and departmental or office
14 organization.

15 No new positions shall be created during any budget year
16 without approval of the majority of the Council. Any consultation
17 fee above five thousand (\$5,000) dollars shall be approved by the
18 Council.
