## ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE providing for the creation of a Division of the Medical Examiner within the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health; amending Ordinance 163, Section 1, Section 6, Section 7 and KCC 2.24.030, and 2.24.060.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

 SECTION 1. Ordinance 163, Section 1, and KCC 2.24.030 are hereby amended as follows:

Apportionment of city and county contributions to health fund. (a) The proportionate share of the city and the county to be contributed and paid into the city-county health fund for the purpose above stated shall be determined by the following formula.

(b) The City of Seattle will pay annually the proportion of the joint use program equivalent to the ratio of the population within its city limits to that of the total of population of King County, and King County will pay annually the proportion of the joint use program equivalent to the ratio of the population within King County, exclusive of the City of Seattle, to the total population of King County.

(c) The official population figures to be used shall be the U. S. Census of 1950, and after 1950 shall be those issued by the Registrar of Vital Statistics of the State Health Department as of July 1, preceding each budget year.

(d) King County will pay the entire cost of functions required to be performed by the statutory office of coroner. All such duties and functions not assigned to the "Seattle-King County Department of Public Health" or necessary and incidental thereto, shall be((performed-by-the-Department-of-Public-Safety)) vested in the County Executive.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 163, Section 6, and KCC 2.24.060 are hereby amended as follows:

Purpose of transfer of duties -- duration of agreement.

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The purpose of the aforesaid transfer of the duties of the coroner is for the purpose of implementing the efficiency of the operation of the function as authorized by Chapter 68 of the Revised Code of Washington. The duration of this agreement shall be ten years. It is the intent of this ordinance that the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health perform the services ascribed to the former coroner as defined by the statutes of the State of Washington except for the function of conducting inquests. The remaining duties of the former coroner relative to conducting inquests are hereby ((transferred-to-the-Department-of Public-Safety)) vested in the County Executive. ((The-Notice required-by-RCW-68.08.020-shall-be-given-to-the-Seattle-King County-Department-of-Public-Health.--The-Property-described-in 68-08-040-shall-be-delivered-to-the-Seattle-King-County Department-of-Public-Health---Income-and-expenditures-shall-be-in accordance-with-Section-430-of-the-King-County-Home-Rule-Charter.)) SECTION 3. Ordinance 163, Section 7 is hereby amended to read as follows: ((This-ordinance-shall-be-in-full-force-and SECTION 7. effect-on-and-after-January-17-1970.)

There is hereby established a division of the Medical
Examiner within the Seattle-King County Department of Public
Health. The division of the Medical Examiner shall be responsible
for the administration and staffing of all department programs
relating to the performance of autopsies and investigation of
death as authorized by the statutes of the State of Washington
except as provided by this ordinance. The division shall include
a Chief Medical Examiner, who shall be a pathologist certified in
Forensic Pathology; an administrator, and such staff as are
necessary to accomplish its duties. The management and
administration of the division shall be vested in the director of
the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health, who shall
appoint a Chief Medical Examiner for the division pursuant to

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Ordinance No. 1438. The Chief Medical Examiner shall have the responsibility for staffing the division in accordance with King County Career Service Personnel Rules; applicable personnel provisions of the Home Rule Charter and Council approved collective bargaining agreements. Employees of the Division of Medical Examiner, with the exception of specifically identified exempt positions, shall be members of the King County Career Service. The division, in order to facilitate efficiency and greater uniformity in carrying out its administrative and professional procedure shall:

- (a) Assume jurisdiction over human remains, perform autopsies and perform such other functions as are authorized by RCW 68.08 and such other statutes of the State of Washington as are applicable, except for the holding of inquests, which function is vested in the County Executive.
- (b) The Chief Medical Examiner shall be authorized to institute other procedures and policies to ensure investigation into the deaths of persons so specified in RCW 68.08 and to ensure the public health.
- (c) The notice required by RCW 68.08.020 shall be given to the division of the Medical Examiner. The division shall be responsible for control and disposition of personal property of deceased persons under the jurisdiction of the division. Such personal property shall be transferred to the next of kin or other legal representatives of the deceased. If such transfer cannot be made because there is not known next of kin or legal representative, or they are not available to accomplish the

2	jurisdiction over the body of the deceased, the personal property
3	shall be deposited with the King County Comptroller, or
4	transferred to an attorney pursuant to the institution of probate
5	action.
