

ORDINANCE NO. 2918

AN ORDINANCE adopting a joint comprehensive solid waste management plan authorized by RCW 70.95.

PREAMBLE:

The Council of King County declares it to be in the public interest for there to be a cooperative, coordinated comprehensive plan for the disposal of all solid waste generated within all municipalities and political subdivisions within the boundaries of King County as well as for all portions of unincorporated King County.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The Council of King County hereby adopts the joint comprehensive solid waste management plan for all jurisdictions within King County as provided for in RCW 70.95, consisting of the RIBCO Environmental Management for the Metropolitan Area Part IV, Solid Waste, December, 1974, METRO Resolution No. 2328 accepting and approving for submission to governmental agencies an integrated environmental management plan for the metropolitan area, Exhibit "E" (Solid Waste Management Policies) passed August 21, 1975, and the Final Environmental Impact Statement King County Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan and Minimum Functional Standards for Solid Waste Handling sponsored by the City of Seattle, King County and the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health, a copy of which is attached hereto and by this reference made a part of hereof, as a plan for the adoption of a comprehensive countywide solid disposal program which will prevent land, air and water pollution and conserve the natural and economic resources of this area.


1            SECTION 2. The collection of solid waste by private certificated  
2 carriers in King County has provided excellent levels of service. The  
3 County in adopting the attached King County Comprehensive Solid Waste  
4 Management Plan proposed by the River Basin Coordinating Committee is not  
5 adopting as the policy of the County any recommendation for the County to,  
6 and does not intend for the County to, provide collection services by  
7 County personnel or by licensing, franchising or contracting with private  
8 collectors.


