## ORDINANCE NO. 2935

AN ORDINANCE establishing a Division of Human Services and a Division of Corrections within the Department of Rehabilitative Services; repealing Ordinance 2072, and K.C.C. 2.16.150 through 2.16.210; amending Ordinance 1872, Section 2 and 3 as amended, and K.C.C. 2.16.130 and 2.32.110.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 2072 and K.C.C. 2.16.150 through ... 2.16.210 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 1872, Section 2, and K.C.C. 2.16.130 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Department of Rehabilitative Services -- Duties -Divisions. The department of rehabilitative services shall be
responsible for the administration of the divisions of
((involuntary-treatment,-detention,-elient-services,-and-judicial
services-and-shall-include-a-research-and-evaluation-function,))
human services and corrections.

(((a)--INVOLUNTARY-TREATMENT-DIVISION---The-involuntary
treatment-division-shall-be-responsible-for-the-administration-of
programs-relating-to-the-involuntary-treatment-and-commitment-of
the-mentally-ill-))

(((+b)--DETENTION-DIVISION---The-detention-division-shall be-responsible-for-the-administration-ef-eriminal-detention facilities-and-work-release-programs-))

(((e)--CLIENT-SERVICES-DIVISION---The-elient-services
division-shall-be-responsible-for-service-contract-development
and-negotiation,-pre-sentence-diagnosis-and-reporting,-and
rehabilitation-services-))

(((d)--JUDICIAL-SERVICES-DIVISION---The-judicial services-division-shall-be-responsible-for-pre-trial-release information-eellection-and-post-sentence-monitoring-))

(a) HUMAN SERVICES DIVISION. The human services division shall be responsible for the administration of programs relating to the involuntary treatment and commitment of the mentally ill; for assisting the community mental health administrative board, board for developmental disabilities and drug commission in developing program policies; for assisting the aforementioned boards and commission in developing positions for implementing policies through the policy-making and appropriation authority of the council and the administrative prerogatives of the executive.

(1) Within ten days of the effective date of this ordinance, the director of the Department of Rehabilitative Services shall appoint the manager of the division of human services.

Subsequent to the initial appointment, the manager of the division of human services shall be appointed by the director of the Department of Rehabilitative Services from a list of at least five nominees submitted by a committee composed of the chairmen of the community mental health administrative board, board for developmental disabilities, and drug commission. If the director does not appoint from the list of nominees the director may request a new list from the committee. In the event the list is not forthcoming within thirty days following a vacancy of the position or request for a list, the director shall appoint the manager.

(2) The manager is responsible for staffing and supervising the staff of the division pursuant to career service rules and budgetary constraints of the King County Charter. The exempt positions of program coordinator for the mental health, developmental disabilities, and drug abuse programs shall be appointed by the manager from a list of five nominees submitted by the appropriate board, nominee to be certified by the Personnel Division as technically qualified for the position. If the manager does not appoint from the list of certified nominees, he may request a new certified list from the board.

 (3) The manager of the Division of Human Services shall:

- (a) Provide the boards, County Executive and County Council with information, analysis, and related staff assistance needed for the development, recommendation and adoption of policies and plans for the mental health, developmental disabilities and drug abuse programs;
- (b) Allocate sufficient staffing support to the boards and commission to allow them to carry out their responsibilities;
- (c) Monitor and evaluate service providers to assure compliance with contracts and policies.
- (4) No provision of this ordinance shall be interpreted to lessen or diminish the statutory authority and responsibilities of the boards.

No provision of this ordinance shall be construed to limit the power of the boards and commission to report directly to the County Council or Executive.

- (5) There is hereby created an administration committee consisting of the chairman and vice chairman of each of the boards and commission. The administration committee shall meet at least annually, on the call of any one of its members, to review and comment on the administration budget and objectives proposed by the manager of the division of human services.
- (b) CORRECTIONS DIVISION. The corrections division shall be responsible for the administration of criminal detention facilities and work release programs, service contract development and negotiation, presentence diagnosis and reporting, rehabilitation services, pretrial release information collection and postsentence monitoring.

services, except the chief officer of the department and its divisions, ((and)) their administrative assistants and confidential secretary, and one program coordinator assigned to the mental health board, developmental disabilities board and drug abuse commission, appointed pursuant to Article 5, Section 550 of the King County Charter, shall be members of the career service system; provided this provision shall not include commissioned members of the department of public safety or Seattle police department, temporarily assigned to the department of rehabilitative services.

 $\underline{\text{SECTION 3}}$ . Ordinance 1872, Section 3, and KCC 2.32.110 are hereby amended to read as follows:

There is established a ((Beard-of-Rehavilitative Services)) Board of Corrections hereinafter referred to as the Board consisting of thirteen members. The members shall consist of the following or a designated representative: The Chairman of the King County Magistrate's Association, the Presiding Judge of the Seattle Municipal Court, the Presiding Judge of the King County Superior Court, the Chairman of the Juvenile Court Management Committee, the Director of the King County Department of Public Safety, the Administrator of the King County Office of Public Defense, the King County Prosecuting Attorney, the Mayor of the City of Seattle, the president of the King County Suburban Mayors' Association, the Chief of the Seattle Police Department, the Dean of the University of Washington School of Law and the Dean of the University of Washington School of Social Work. In addition the King County Executive shall appoint one member who shall have been incarcerated in a King County detention facility within three years prior to the appointment. The Director of the Department of Rehabilitative Services shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member.
