AN ORDINANCE establishing a Division of Human Services and a Division of Corrections within the Department of Rehabilitative Services; repealing Ordinance 2072, and K.C.C. 2.16.150 through 2.16.210; amending Ordinance 1872, Section 2 and 3 as amended, and K.C.C. 2.16.130 and 2.32.110.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 2072 and K.C.C. 2.16.150 through 2.16.210 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 1872, Section 2, and K.C.C. 2.16.130 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Department of Rehabilitative Services -- Duties -- Divisions. The department of rehabilitative services shall be responsible for the administration of the divisions of ~~((involuntary-treatment,-detention,-client-services,-and-judicial services-and-shall-include-a-research-and-evaluation-function-))~~ human services and corrections.

~~((a)--INVOLUNTARY-TREATMENT-DIVISION--The-involuntary treatment-division-shall-be-responsible-for-the-administration-of programs-relating-to-the-involuntary-treatment-and-commitment-of the-mentally-ill-))~~

~~((b)--DETENTION-DIVISION--The-detention-division-shall be-responsible-for-the-administration-of-criminal-detention facilities-and-work-release-programs-))~~

~~((c)--CLIENT-SERVICES-DIVISION--The-client-services division-shall-be-responsible-for-service-contract-development and-negotiation,-pre-sentence-diagnosis-and-reporting,-and rehabilitation-services-))~~

~~((d)--JUDICIAL-SERVICES-DIVISION--The-judicial services-division-shall-be-responsible-for-pre-trial-release information,-collection-and-post-sentence-monitoring-))~~

1           (a) HUMAN SERVICES DIVISION. The human services division  
2 shall be responsible for the administration of programs relating  
3 to the involuntary treatment and commitment of the mentally ill;  
4 for assisting the community mental health administrative board,  
5 board for developmental disabilities and drug commission in  
6 developing program policies; for assisting the aforementioned  
7 boards and commission in developing positions for implementing  
8 policies through the policy-making and appropriation authority of  
9 the council and the administrative prerogatives of the executive.

10           (1) Within ten days of the effective date of this ordinance,  
11 the director of the Department of Rehabilitative Services shall  
12 appoint the manager of the division of human services.

13           Subsequent to the initial appointment, the manager of the  
14 division of human services shall be appointed by the director of  
15 the Department of Rehabilitative Services from a list of at  
16 least five nominees submitted by a committee composed of the  
17 chairmen of the community mental health administrative board,  
18 board for developmental disabilities, and drug commission. If  
19 the director does not appoint from the list of nominees the  
20 director may request a new list from the committee. In the event  
21 the list is not forthcoming within thirty days following a  
22 vacancy of the position or request for a list, the director shall  
23 appoint the manager.

24           (2) The manager is responsible for staffing and supervising  
25 the staff of the division pursuant to career service rules and  
26 budgetary constraints of the King County Charter. The exempt  
27 positions of program coordinator for the mental health,  
28 developmental disabilities, and drug abuse programs shall be  
29 appointed by the manager from a list of five nominees submitted  
30 by the appropriate board, nominee to be certified by the Personnel  
31 Division as technically qualified for the position. If the  
32 manager does not appoint from the list of certified nominees, he  
33 may request a new certified list from the board.

1           (3) The manager of the Division of Human Services shall:

2           (a) Provide the boards, County Executive and County Council  
3 with information, analysis, and related staff assistance needed  
4 for the development, recommendation and adoption of policies and  
5 plans for the mental health, developmental disabilities and  
6 drug abuse programs;

7           (b) Allocate sufficient staffing support to the boards and  
8 commission to allow them to carry out their responsibilities;

9           (c) Monitor and evaluate service providers to assure  
10 compliance with contracts and policies.

11           (4) No provision of this ordinance shall be interpreted to  
12 lessen or diminish the statutory authority and responsibilities  
13 of the boards.

14           No provision of this ordinance shall be construed to limit  
15 the power of the boards and commission to report directly to the  
16 County Council or Executive.

17           (5) There is hereby created an administration committee  
18 consisting of the chairman and vice chairman of each of the  
19 boards and commission. The administration committee shall meet  
20 at least annually, on the call of any one of its members, to  
21 review and comment on the administration budget and objectives  
22 proposed by the manager of the division of human services.

23           (b) CORRECTIONS DIVISION. The corrections division shall  
24 be responsible for the administration of criminal detention  
25 facilities and work release programs, service contract development  
26 and negotiation, presentence diagnosis and reporting,  
27 rehabilitation services, pretrial release information collection  
28 and postsentence monitoring.

1 (c) All employees of the department of rehabilitative  
2 services, except the chief officer of the department and its  
3 divisions, ((and)) their administrative assistants and  
4 confidential secretary, and one program coordinator assigned to  
5 the mental health board, developmental disabilities board and  
6 drug abuse commission, appointed pursuant to Article 5, Section  
7 550 of the King County Charter, shall be members of the career  
8 service system; provided this provision shall not include  
9 commissioned members of the department of public safety or Seattle  
10 police department, temporarily assigned to the department of  
11 rehabilitative services.

12 SECTION 3. Ordinance 1872, Section 3, and KCC 2.32.110 are  
13 hereby amended to read as follows:

14 There is established a ((~~Board of Rehabilitative~~  
15 ~~Services~~)) Board of Corrections hereinafter referred to as the  
16 Board consisting of thirteen members. The members shall consist  
17 of the following or a designated representative: The Chairman of  
18 the King County Magistrate's Association, the Presiding Judge of  
19 the Seattle Municipal Court, the Presiding Judge of the King  
20 County Superior Court, the Chairman of the Juvenile Court  
21 Management Committee, the Director of the King County Department  
22 of Public Safety, the Administrator of the King County Office of  
23 Public Defense, the King County Prosecuting Attorney, the Mayor  
24 of the City of Seattle, the president of the King County Suburban  
25 Mayors' Association, the Chief of the Seattle Police Department,  
26 the Dean of the University of Washington School of Law and the  
27 Dean of the University of Washington School of Social Work. In  
28 addition the King County Executive shall appoint one member who  
29 shall have been incarcerated in a King County detention facility  
30 within three years prior to the appointment. The Director of the  
31 Department of Rehabilitative Services shall serve as a nonvoting  
32 ex officio member.

1 The Board shall serve as an advisory body to the  
2 ~~((Director-of-the-Department-of-Rehabilitative-Services))~~ Manager  
3 of the Division of Corrections to review and make recommendations  
4 at least annually for the ~~((Department))~~ Division of Corrections  
5 on its policies, operations and matters of budget.

6 ~~((The-Director-of-the-Department-of-Rehabilitative~~  
7 ~~Services-shall-be-appointed-by-the-County-Executive-from-a-list~~  
8 ~~of-at-least-three-names-submitted-by-the-Board-of-Rehabilitative~~  
9 ~~Services-and-shall-be-subject-to-the-approval-of-the-County~~  
10 ~~Council-))~~)

11 The executive is directed to perform a study and make  
12 recommendations to the council, prior to October 1, 1977, of the  
13 organizational and administrative feasibility of incorporating  
14 the Division of Alcoholism into the Department of Rehabilitative  
15 Services.
