STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of an alley in Southern Pacific Land Company's Huntington Park Addition to Des Moines, hereinafter described.
- 2. The report of the Department of Public Works and Transportation and the Division of Building and Land Development, finds that the portion to be vacated is useless to the county and the vacation would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of the proposed vacation.
- 3. The Plat of Southern Pacific Land Company's Huntington Park Addition to Des Moines was recorded in October 25, 1889, and there is no evidence that the alley has ever been opened. Records indicate that the County has expended no funds for the acquisition or maintenance of the alley.
- 4. The right-of-way is considered useless as part of the County road system and it is believed the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due Notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the State day of Movember, 1976.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF KING:

SECTION 1. The Council on the 8th day of Mountain 1976, hereby vacates and abandons the alley in Southern Pacific Land Company's Huntington Park Addition to Des Moines, described as follows:
