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ORDINANCE NO. 3099

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AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 2988, Section 45,  
as it relates to dental care for juveniles.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 2988, Section 45, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Public Health Pooling - From the Public Health Pooling Fund there is hereby appropriated: \$4,291,759

PROVIDED THAT:

- 1) (~~(\$18,000)~~) \$8,000 of this appropriation shall be allocated to service contracts with community health clinics and \$10,000 of this appropriation shall be allocated to the department for dental care for juveniles.
- 2) \$23,101 of this appropriation shall be held in appropriated reserve for the Children and Youth Clinic, to be expended if the City of Seattle appropriates an additional \$18,150 for the operation of the clinic.
- 3) \$52,413 of this appropriation shall be spent for enforcement of the provisions of the noise control ordinance.
- 4) Any excess funds in the salary contingency appropriation shall be placed in a contingency fund for costs of transferring the Administration of the department from the City of Seattle to King County.
- 5) \$19,800 of this appropriation shall be allocated to service contracts with Neighborhood Health Centers of Seattle for general dental care for low income adults.
- 6) \$63,250 of this appropriation shall be used to fund two positions each with Neighborhood Health Centers of Seattle and Central Seattle Community Health Centers to provide primary health care for low income persons. It is the intent of the Council that these positions be funded the County funds for a maximum of two years and that funding for ongoing staff support should be obtained from other sources after 1978.

The Council intends that:

- 1. The Department of Health, in conjunction with appropriate county and city departments, develop a proposal for a study on the feasibility of self-insurance for malpractice liability and present such proposal to the Council for its approval by April 1, 1977. Such proposal will include consideration of self-insurance for limited liability and appropriate consultation with the private sector.

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2. The Department submit to the County Board of Health a proposed revision of food service inspection fees which will increase revenues to make inspection program self-supporting and which will increase equity in the fee schedule.
