STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of South 139th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 3. The Department of Public Works has contacted the various utilities serving the area and were notified that easements are not required.
- 4. The existing location of South 139th Street has been recognized and documented in two previous King County Vacation Orders and is shown in Volume 5 of Surveys, page 64, Records of King County.
- 5. This vacation petition requests the vacation of that portion lying 30 feet southerly of the existing centerline. The area is a portion of a Statutory Quit Claim Deed from Norma D. Britz to King County recorded in Volume 1541 of Deeds, page 254, Records of King County on January 12, 1933.
- 6. A search of the records indicate that the County has spent no funds for its acquisition or maintenance. Right-of-way would be classified "C Class" in accordance with County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 7. The Department of Public Works considers the subject right-of-way useless as part of the County road system and believe the public would be benefited by the approval of the vacation petition.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the 14th day of March, 1977.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.
