ORDINANCE NO. 3156

1 AN ORDINANCE relating to per diem for the Board
2 of Appeals, amending Ordinance No. 509, Section
1 and K.C.C. 2.32.090.

3 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

4 SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 509, Section 1, and K.C.C. 2.32.090 are
5 amended to read as follows:

6 Board of Appeals to hear appeals on property taxes and business
7 licenses - per diem allowance.

8 (a) In conformity with the new specifications of Chapter 55, 41st
9 Legislature, 2nd Extra Session, and in addition to those powers relating to
10 valuation provided for in Charter Section 720, the Board of Appeals shall
11 hear and decide all appeals and such other matters specified by RCW 84.48.010
12 (relating to the July Board of Equalization) RCW 84.56.390, RCW 84.56.400
13 (relating to the treasurer's June Board of Equalization), and RCW 84.52.090
14 (relating to the assessor's November Board of Equalization) as amended to
15 July 1, 1970. Any member disqualified by Section 3 of said Chapter 55 may
16 obtain temporary leave of absence by order of the County Executive or his
17 designee in the premises.

18 (b) The Board of Appeals shall hear and decide all appeals resulting
19 from the denial, suspension or revocation of business licensing.

20 (c) For time devoted to official work of the Board of Appeals, each
21 member thereof shall receive a per diem allowance of (~~fifty dollars~~)
22 seventy-five dollars, provided that a per diem allowance of (~~twenty-five~~
23 ~~dollars~~) thirty-five dollars shall be paid for official board work of (~~three~~)
24 four hours or less.

25 (d) Decisions of the King County assessor in taxpayer-claims for
26 relief of taxes and assessments on real or personal property destroyed by
27 fire or act of God, as provided for in Chapter 120 Laws of 1975, 1st

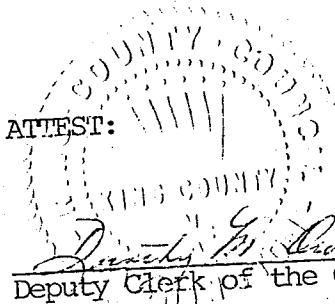
1 Extraordinary Session, and RCW 35.21.080 and RCW Ch. 84.70 shall in the
2 event the taxpayer wishes to appeal, be first appealed to the board of
3 appeals; provided that the decision of the board of appeals may be appealed
4 to the King County council. The decision of the council shall be final.
